2012 Paediatric Update No. 3

The Paediatric Update No. 3 seminar on **Topics in Paediatric Neurology** is scheduled to be held at the **HK Academy Medicine Building** on **Sunday afternoon**, **2 December 2012**, immediately preceeding the College AGM. There will be review lectures on acute disseminating encephalomyelitis & related inflammatory diseases of the central nervous system, infection-related encephalopathies, and case presentations on acute necrotising encephalopathy and anti-NMDA-receptor antibody encephalitis. Child Protection Course

The College will be conducting the 6th Child Protection Course on Saturday, 17 November 2012. It will be a whole day training course consisting of role-play, lectures and class discussions. Associates, Members and Fellows of the College are welcome to apply. Trainees are especially encouraged to apply early since the course has become a mandatory requirement for the Paediatric Fellowship curriculum. Application is now open until **22 October 2012**. <u>Application form and announcement poster are attached (appendix 3)</u> for your information.

Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP)

The Neonatal Resuscitation Program Provider Courses, organized by the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians, The Hong Kong Society of Neonatal Medicine and the Hong Kong Paediatric Nurses Association, were fully booked in 2012. The Courses in January to March, 2013 are now open for enrollment.

The course member needs to study the NRP Textbook and complete the online examination before they could participate in the one-day (usually Sunday) practice and stimulation training program, when they will have the opportunity to interact with paediatric doctors, paediatric nurses, nurse midwives, A&E colleagues and other healthcare professionals from the HA and private hospitals. Team collaboration and dynamics are emphasized. The instructors are AAP Regional Instructors with ongoingnewborn deliveries experiences. The course fee is HK\$2,000, covering the textbook, online exam and practicum.

We are also recruiting potential NRP Instructors. Please kindly nominate senior medical and nursing colleagues from your department who are working in the neonatal wards with ongoingnewborn resuscitation experiences if they are interested to become AAP NRP Instructors. They have to take the Provider Course, act as Instructor Associates in two practicum days and take the AAP NRP Instructor Training Course to become qualified.

Subject to endorsement by the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, the NRP Provider Course will become mandatory for the trainees joining the College from July 2013 onwards.

Order of taking written examinations

From 2013 the written papers can be taken in the candidate's order of preference. Candidates may choose to apply for Foundation of Practice, Theory & Science of Practice or Applied Knowledge in Paediatrics as their <u>first</u> MRCPCH exam. But the MRCPCH Clinical Examination can be taken only until all written components have been passed.

7-Year to complete all MRCPCH examinations

All RCPCH exam candidates are locked into a <u>7-year</u> registration period <u>to complete</u> all of the components (written AND clinical) of their chosen exam route. For the MRCPCH the 7-year registration period begins from the date the candidate passed the first written exam. This could be any of the written exam components, which include Foundation of Practice, Theory and Science of Practice or Applied Knowledge in Paediatrics.

For the DCH, the 7-year registration period begins from the date that the candidate has passed the written component of the exam.
