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Message from the President

The next **Annual General Meeting** of the College will be held on Thursday, 30 November 2000. I sincerely hope that you will attend this meeting and the Admission Ceremony for new Fellows. Do join the Annual Dinner that follows with your spouse and enjoy an evening of leisure with your colleagues. By the next AGM I will have served you as the President for three years. I wish to express my sincere gratitude to you for your advice, support and guidance you have given to me and to the Council during the past three years.

There are some new developments in the College. You may wish to know that an **Information Technology Committee**, under the chairmanship of Dr. CHIU Cheung Shing, Daniel, has been established to oversee the development of IT functions in the College. An important objective is to enhance the communication between the Council and our members. The Council hopes that it will eventually be able to communicate with every member of the College in the future by electronic means.

Another development is on the **Clinical Practice Guidelines**. Under the convenorship of Dr. Betty YOUNG and Dr. Alfred TAM, the Working Group on Clinical Practice Guidelines has been working on two conditions viz. febrile convulsion and gastroenteritis in the past months. It is hope that the draft on febrile convulsion will soon be ready for consultation after a panel of independent Fellows has reviewed it. An open forum will then be held to introduce the guideline to the members of the College and to receive feedbacks from them. The aim is to encourage good clinical practice based on evidence by all paediatricians of Hong Kong.

You may be aware that the **Second International Medical Congress of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine** entitled 'Medical Advances and Information in the New Millennium' will be held on 2 to 5 November. Our College has taken part in the planning and organization of this conference. Please do not miss such a good opportunity to update your knowledge.

The College has now full-time staff to man the Secretariat. I am also available at the College Chamber several times a week. Please phone up or drop in whenever you wish to talk to me or obtain any information from the Secretariat. I welcome and value your advice and counsel.

Dr Patricia Ip has been recently awarded the C. Henry Kempe Award by ISPCAN (International Society for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect). The C. Henry Kempe Award, established in 1984, is given every 2 years to an outstanding young professional or organization working in the field of child abuse and neglect. The award is intended to bring international visibility to the accomplishments of young professionals or organizations, to assist their work, and to inspire others to follow their lead. The 2000 Award was presented at ISPCAN's 13th International Congress on Child Abuse & Neglect in Durban, South Africa, to Dr. Patricia Ip. Dr Ip is well recognised for her hard working in prevention of child abuse and neglect in Hong Kong. She is the first Chinese awarded with this honour!

Exit Assessment

The coming Exit Assessment for members who have completed 3 years of higher training will be held on 13 December 2000. The deadline for application will be on 15 October 2000. Details of application and guidelines are shown in appendix 1.

From the Education Committee / CME Subcommittee

The following policies regarding CME have been endorsed by the Council in the 69th Council Meeting on 14 September 2000.

- Accreditation of Taught Courses
 All taught courses of significant duration will
 only be accredited up to a ceiling of 18 CME
 hours, i.e. to the same ceiling limit as
 conferences.
- 2. <u>Retrospective Application of Accreditation of</u> <u>CME activities</u>
 - a. The time limit for retrospective application of accreditation of Category A activities is extended to 3 months applications need to reach the College Secretariat not later than 3 months from the date of the meeting.
 - b. Category B & D activities will not be retrospectively accredited. Prior application for approval is required.

c. Publications (Category C activity) will be accredited after they had been published and will be credited to the same CME cycle year in which the paper concerned appeared in publication.

These rules will apply to both local and overseas Fellows.

3. <u>False or Inaccurate Reporting of CME Activity</u> <u>Attendance to CME Subcommittee</u> In the annual audit on CME returns, when the activities claimed by a Fellow are found to be discrepant from the official attendance records received by the College, the concerned Fellow would be invited to provide explanation and further documentation to substantiate the submitted claims. Fellows are reminded that fraudulent or false submission may be subjected to disciplinary action by the College.

New Channel for Application of All kinds of CME Activities

All submissions for application of CME points can now be made directly through the College secretary. The application form for accreditation of Category A meeting is available in the Log Book. You may fax the form to the College Secretary directly. Members do not have to send in applications on different categories of activities to different places.

New Requirement on Submission of CME Annual Return Forms

From January 2001, submission of CME Annual Report Forms should be accompanied by the log sheets and photocopies of certificates of attendance relevant to the CME points claimed that year.

Progress on Clinical Practice Guidelines

Prof Virginia Wong and Prof Tony Nelson are coordinating the working groups on febrile convulsion and gastroenteritis. It is hope that the draft on febrile convulsion will be ready soon. It will then go through a critical review by a Review Panel formed by Fellows of that subspecialty and also general paediatricians.

Appendix 1

GUIDELINES FOR EXIT ASSESSMENT

A. Areas of Assessment:-

The assessment consists of 4 parts:-

- (1) For dissertations:-
 - (a) 4 papers are required, with one from each of the following 3 categories:
 - (i) research project/study
 - (ii) reviews of literature of a clinical problem
 - (iii) case report

however, full research/study (not approved protocols, or unfinished studies) can replace any one of the other two categories.

- (b) For papers on research project/study, reviewing of cases of a condition is acceptable but the candidate must be the first author. For published research project/study and approved protocols of which the candidate is not the first author, he/she should have *a significant contribution (at least 40%)* to the project/study, and certification by the first author and supervisor is required. Unfinished research projects are acceptable.
- (c) For *Review of literature* and Case reports, the candidate must be the first author.
- (d) No two papers should be of the same topic.
- (e) Candidates are advised not to submit more than 4 papers. If so, he/she would be requested to choose 4 papers for assessment.
- (f) No papers after deadline for application will be accepted, and candidates will not be able to present themselves for the Assessment.
- (2) For Clinical Experience/Competence

Candidates would be assessed on the approach to problem formulation and clinical management, more than on book-knowledge and minute details. They would be assessed on their clinical judgement and competence in dealing with clinical problems.

- (3) For Service Related Issues Candidates would be assessed on how their clinical experience enables them in handling service related matters, e.g. medical legal problems, ethical issues, risk management, communication skills, doctor-patient relationship, clinical audit, quality assurance programmes, training and supervision of staff, etc.
- (4) For Critical Paper Appraisal Candidates will be assessed on how to read a paper regarding methodology, evaluation of results and clinical relevance.

B. Format:-

Duration:- -60 minutes for reading a paper selected from a recent journal for appraisal (to discuss with assessors during assessment) -about 60 minutes for assessment in the form of an interview by 3 assessors Assessors:- each candidate will by assessed by 3 assessors among whom there is a senior assessor; for the part on clinical competence he/she will be interviewed by all 3 assessors, and the senior assessor will review the higher training program of the candidate; and the other parts will be assessed by 2 of the 3 assessors

Assessment Schedule:

Clinical competence	(15 minutes)	3 assessors*
Service provision issues	(10 minutes)	2 assessors
Dissertation	(20 minutes)	2 assessors
Critical appraisal	(10 minutes)	2 assessors
of a scientific paper		

* candidate's clinical experience during higher training will be reviewed by the senior assessor

C. Marking:-

- (a) Each part will be marked by an agreed score from the 3 assessors as:
 - 5 for excellence
 - 4 for good pass
 - 3 for pass
 - 2 for failure
 - 1 for bad failure

(b) Total score and mark as a percentage of 100:

Clinical competence and dissertation have more weighting constituting 30% each, and service provision issues and critical paper appraisal of 20% each. Thus, scores for clinical competence and dissertation will be multiplied by a factor of 6, and scores for service provision and critical paper appraisal by a score of 4, to make up a total score to be converted as a percentage of 100.

D. Passing the assessment

Grade A	85 - 100
Grade B	70 - 84
Grade C	55 - 69
Grade D	40 - 54
Grade E	below 40

Candidates who score Grade A, B, and C pass the assessment, provided he/she has not scored a bad failure in any one of the four parts. Those who score Grade D fail the assessment, and score Grade E fail it badly.

EXIT ASSESSMENT OF THE HONG KONG COLLEGE OF PAEDIATRICIANS

- 1. The Exit Assessment for Members for consideration of elevation to Fellowship of the College will be held twice a year in June and December. Only Members who would have completed their Higher Training by 30th June or 31st December would be allowed to apply for the Exit Assessment in June and December respectively.
- 2. With effect from the 1st October 1998, Members of the College who have completed their three years of Higher Training and any medical practitioners registered in Hong Kong who have acquired the necessary qualifications, experiences and training recognized by the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians for higher training in paediatrics will have to sit and pass the Exit Assessment of the College before consideration of elevation to the Fellowship of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians.
- 3. The Exit Assessment would take the form of an oral assessment without a clinical examination and each assessment will usually not last for more than an hour.
- 4. The Board of Examiners will be appointed by the College for each candidate and will consist of three assessors who are not trainers/supervisors of the candidate during his/her higher training.
- 5. Deadline of Application: 15.10.2000
- 6. Assessment Fee: HK\$4,000
- 7. Application forms are available from The Secretariat of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians (Tel: 2871 8871/Fax: 2785 1850), and applications should be returned to the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians, Room 808, Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Hong Kong.
- 8. The completed application form should be submitted with:
 - (i) Certified true copies of certificates
 - (ii) 2 photographs certified by one of the proposers
 - (iii) 4 dissertations with one from each of the following categories:
 - a) research project
 - b) critical review of a clinical problem
 - c) case report dissertations comprising only of original research or critical review are also acceptable.
 - d) for candidates re-sitting the Exit Assessment, the previously submitted dissertations with revision can be used.
 - (iv) Log sheets of higher training and assessment by Trainers and Supervisors
 - (v) A cheque of \$4,000.00 for the Exit Assessment made payable to the "Hong Kong College of Paediatricians".
- 9. A receipt would be issued upon submission of an application but only applications with the complete submissions of documents required elaborated in point 8 would be processed.
