25th Annual General Meeting, Fellows Conferment Ceremony and 25th Anniversary Celebration Dinner on 3 December, 2016

The 25th Annual General Meeting was held successfully on 3 December, 2016 at Lim Por Yen Theatre of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building. The minutes of the 24th AGM held on 5 December, 2015 and of the EGM held on 29 May 2016 were adopted.

There are three vacancies for Council Members for the term (Year 2016 – 2019). Four nominations were received for the three vacant posts as on 3rd October 2016, the nomination closing date. An election was carried out by way of postal ballot. Prof Chan Chi Fung Godfrey, Dr Fong Nai Chung and Prof Li Chi Kong were elected as Council Members of the College for the years 2016-2019. Mr. Kenneth Sit was re-appointed as the College's Honorary Legal Advisor and Walter Ma & Co. Auditor respectively.

The 2017 subscription fees would be revised as follows: HK\$2,100 for Fellows, HK\$1,050 for Overseas Fellows, HK\$1,400 for Members, HK\$700 for Overseas Members and HK\$700 for Associates. The subscription fee for paediatricians aged 65 or above before 1st Jan., 2017 would continue to be waived.

The Annual General Meeting was followed by the Admission Ceremony of the New Members and conferment of New Fellows.

The highlight of the day was certainly the Annual Dinner attended by more than 210 members of the College and guests. We are indebted to Prof Fok Tai Fai, Vice-President of the HK Academy of Medicine, Prof Sophia Chan, JP, Under Secretary for Food & Health of the HKSAR Government, Dr Tony Ko, Cluster Chief Executive, New Territories West Cluster of the Hong Kong Hospital Authority, the Hon. Dr. Pierre Chan Pui Yin, LegCo Member, the Presidents and representatives of Sister Colleges and statutory organizations, as well as representatives from overseas paediatric colleges from China, Singapore, Malaysia and Macau who showered grace to our days' events with their presence and blessings.

In commemorating our 25th Anniversary, a special anniversary album entitled "Nurturing Growing - a Journey of 25 Years" was published. The book has recorded interviews of 19 senior colleagues by our young members, narrating the life experience of some highly respected forefathers of our profession. All members will be sent a copy.

With the New Year ahead, we look optimistically to the future of our College as we make bold strides on together.

President's Speech at Conferment Ceremony on 3 December 2016

Professor Fok, [Professor Sophie Chan], Dr The Honorable Pierre Chan, Dr Tony Ko, Dr Tse HH, Professor Thong MK, Professor Zhao ZY, Professor Marion Aw, Dr May Leung, Professor Li TY, Professor Fang JP, Presidents of sister Colleges, Past Presidents of our College, Fellows, Members, Ladies and Gentleman,

I welcome you warmly to our 25th Conferment Ceremony and thank you sincerely for honouring us with your presence. This ceremony is to acknowledge the hard-won accomplishment of our 25 new Fellows and 5 new Members in General Paediatrics, as well as the 4 First Fellows in Developmental-Behavioural Paediatrics, 3 First Fellows in Paediatric Neurology and 20 First Fellows in Paediatric Respiratory Medicine. You have worked hard to achieve this status of being recognized by the College and the Academy, to be trusted by our community to be able to deliver excellent care for our sick children and at the same time promote health for the general childhood population, as the concern of our discipline has moved and expanded to include the whole community.

Some of your family members are here tonight to share your joy and glory and you should feel proud and fulfilled. Nevertheless with this recognition and pride, it comes with responsibility and commitment. Remember your responsibility to your child patients must take priority above all other concerns. Remember your commitment to deliver the best possible care. These are the core value and reasons why we are here. I assure you with this firmly set in your heart, you will feel fulfilled and contented throughout your professional life.

One year has gone since I assumed Presidency. There were three goals I highlighted last year during our Annual Banquet. First is to engage actively our general membership to ensure you feel ownership. Second is to empower our young to acquire leadership role for effective succession. Third is to achieve secure financial position for ensuring we have the funding to achieve our missions.

Our Council has worked hard in the past year to achieve these goals, building on the solid foundation laid down by our previous Presidents and Councils over the last 25 years. The present Council stands on the shoulder of the previous Councils to continue the journey of ensuring high standard of our profession so as to serve our child patients.

To promote sense of ownership, our College has organized three Forums on "Use of diagnostic tests & Tamiflu in influenza", "Position Statement on the Medical Registration (Amendment) Bill 2016 issued by HKAM 29th June 2016" and "Impact of Hong Kong Children's Hospital on the future Paediatric Training and Services". I have to thank the Young Fellows Sub-Committee and the Committee for Subspecialty Boards in initiating and planning these Forums. The Council has agreed to host similar Forums in the future to discuss and share our views on any issue that arouse enough interest among our membership, so as to ensure you feel the College is yours.

Indeed, our College Working Group on the Review of Training and Assessment will organize a Forum on training in the first quarter of 2017. This Working Group has identified eight domains for us to enhance our training: 1. Handover, 2. End-of-Life care, 3.Risk & Conflict, 4. Ethics & Law, 5. Teaching, 6. Critical appraisal of literature, 7. Multi-disciplinary team, 8. Humanistic qualities. We feel strongly our trainees need to have better systematic training to resolve conflicts, to care for the dying, to work as an effective team player, to teach, to research and above all, to walk the talk on the ethical and humanistic dimensions of our profession. Our council fully realizes easier said than done, we need your participation to make this change come true.

To further promote ownership, our Young Fellows with 19 senior colleagues have come up with a publication "Nurturing, Growing - A Journey of 25 years". The goal of this publication is to enable our young fellows to learn about our past, so as to understand how we arrive at where we are now, and ultimately to empower them to plan the future.

When I first read the young fellows' narrations of the life experiences of our senior colleagues, I was touched and overwhelmed with the sincerity, passion and concern expressed about our profession, and most of all about the children and their families for whom we care. I was at the same time hugely satisfied with the revelation and inspiration felt by the young fellows through these interviews. The young fellows have matured and become wiser through interviewing their seniors and understood the history of the development of our profession better. They also realized what we have in 2016 represent the result of enormous and sustained contribution from many senior colleagues over many decades. I certainly hope these experiences will help our young fellows chart the course of our future.

As for myself, I have learnt as much as being encouraged through reading these interviews that our generations graduating from 1955 to 1980's are sharing many of the same core values and life attitudes. They are professionalism, passion, team spirit, life-long and self-learning, sharing, networking, perseverance, open-mindedness, flexibility, 'can-do' attitude, vision, advocacy, collaboration, connection, mindfulness, tolerance as it leads to balance, and respect diversity as it is the origin of life and creativity.

We live in an era of mistrust, intolerance and inequities, accentuated by the increasing rich-poor gap and the differing perspectives of life between the old and the young. Nevertheless we live in the same one world and if we care enough to connect with one another, we may be able to narrow the gap. Having the above-mentioned core values will certainly help.

We need to refocus at the foundation of our medical profession which is caring and sharing. I hope this collection of memories and reflections together with the awarding winning photos will awaken the forgotten feeling of why we want to study medicine and become a doctor when we first entered medical school.

Last but not least, I have to express my most sincere and heart-felt gratitude to our immediate Past President, Dr SN Wong. I am indeed blessed to have the opportunity to serve as his Vice President and we together shared our dream of what we want to achieve at the beginning of his Presidency in 2012. What I have been driving for the College in 2016 is a continuation of what we planned in 2012.

The above account is by no means an exhaustive narration of the work done by the Council, various Committees and the Working Groups in the past one year. I have to thank sincerely for all those who have helped our College to function harmoniously and to make our dream come true, including our efficient and hardworking College secretaries. Finally we need the support of our general membership to make our College strong and united. Let us celebrate our 25 years together now.
