In Hong Kong There is no terrorist attack! No shooting in schools! Yet Violence is found everywhere, in Family, School, Hospital, Institution, Community, Internet, **Policy and Practice.**

Children's rights violation in the news

- 5 year old Lam Lam suspected abused and murdered by close family members.
- 6 year old ADHD boy strangulated by his desperate grandma.
- 12 year old girl incapacitated by mother.
- 15 year old girl who got a modelling job online was brutally killed and raped.
- 6 year old boy in substance abuse family died of ice (methamphetamine).
- The boy bullied online felt desperate and killed himself
- Suicide girl and sister without child registration for years.
- 1 7 days infant found positive in ice.
- A man who lost control by shaking and maltreating a young child. The mother failed to stop such abuse acts.
- 4 year old girl in the care of two carers was admitted in AE.
- 7 year old girl seriously mal-nourished and upon admission at AE "suspected" already dead.
- Boy punished by father to cross the road by kneeling.
- #Me Too: Hidden sexual abuse cases shocked the world, victims came forward after years of nightmare
- Helper jailed for 3 months for publishing video of naked children in shower.
- Daughter raped by father for years claimed to have tolerated for filial piety.
- 16 year old (part-time girlfriend)arrested by police was found previously sexually abused.
- 7 year old child sexually abused by a 9 year old in residential centre.
- 小子恩's heart stopped after operation, yet was mistaken for medical device failure.
- Ethnic minority preschoolers rejected placement as non Chinese speaking.



Fatality Review

- Three common errors
 - » not recognizing and reporting serious and unstable situations
 - > inadequate risk assessment
 - poor inter agency collaboration and coordination.

Contributing Factors to Abuse

- Distorted beliefs and unrealistic expectations
- Inability to cope with stress and anger
- Inability to cope with developmental needs or difficulties of child
- Potent support network inadequate
- Strategic resource distribution not in place

Two Major Approaches to Risk Assessment

> Clinical judgment:

can be subjective and impressionistic
 (address individual differences)

> Actuarial Risk Assessment:

 Statistical information to predict reoffending demography & history
 (draw reference from generalized characteristics)

Pre-conditions for Risk Assessment

- Rapport Building
- Safety Comes First
- Consent & Confidentiality

Concerns raised by Medical Coordinators on Child Abuse of Hospital Authority

- Need for a structured framework for Risk Assessment
- Need for better support for child placement
- Need for a common protocol in handling children under care of substance abusers
- Need for a system change to retain clinical expertise and avoid frequent change of case worker/ manager
- Need for the procedural Guide to address new and emerging issues
- Need for a responsive system with emergency contact and hotline support

 - Actualize prevention and improve cure!


Legal protection of children with a Child perspective

- 1. Sets the baseline in the society, for education and direction.
- 2. Protects the rights and well being of citizens, especially the under 18.
 - 3. Sanctions those who violate the law.
 - 4. Deters future violations.

Banning of corporal punishment As of May 2017

Total Ban in all settings

- 53 States formed laws to prohibit all corporal punishment of children in all settings, including home.
- ♦ 56 others made commitment to achieving this law reform.

Sweden Anti Spanking Law 1979

- Outside home setting
- 60 States Prohibition in alternative care & day care
 - 131 States in all schools
 - 139 States in all penal institutions
 - 165 States as a sentence for crime

Witnessing Domestic Violence is Traumatic

- 1. Any children involved directly or indirectly
- 2. Their age and vulnerability
- 3. Any emotional, behavior, academic, social impacts observed or suspected
- 4. Any previous conflicts, threats or harm inflicted on spouse, the child, siblings or others
- 5. Any physical or mental problems
- 6. Any health care concerns identified
- 7. Other environmental problems such as financial hardship, crowded living conditions, unemployment

In UK, in 2017, allowing a child's death without intervening is a crime

In UK, online raping is a crime, there is no need of actual physical contact.

In UK, Australian witnessing domestic violence is defined as abuse and protected by law

Child Sexual Abuse

Ratio of sexual abuse cases

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1990 2%
2016 35% (294 out of total cases 892)
All age group: Age 0-2 (1) Majority 12-17 (205)
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- Criminal Procedure Ordinance amendments
- Repealing corroborated evidence
- > Video recording of interviews in court
- Live TV links in courts
- Magistrate removing wig and gown for children witnesses
- > Increasing maximum sentencing

Psychological Well Being

- 2005 Family Health Service, Department of Health, Child Behavior and Emotion Study
 - ➤ 10% 13% 4-year-old children display behaviour diagnosis of potentially significant psychopathology.
 - > 10% -15% preschool children with behavioural problems. (Preschool population : 149,141)

Psychological Well Being

A recent study re depression
 53% of Secondary school student respondents found with depressive symptoms
 12,000 respondents found seriously depressive 3,000 found with suicidal ideation
 In 2016, 20 such students committed suicide

WHO data

300 million people under the threat of depression. In 2020 Depression will be the second to coronary disease to be the major burden in terms of sickness.

In 2005, CU Medical Faculty's study indicated around 400,000 adults suffering from degrees of depression.

Review on Mental Health, May 2013 &

A Standing Advisory Committee on Mental Health, in 2017

Came up with 40 recommendations in 20 areas.

Will start in 2019 to study the mental health conditions of children & adolescents in Hong Kong.

Intensive Early Intervention

- In 2001, a 12 year study of 1000 patients with symptoms such as hallucinations or delusions.
- Intensive early intervention programs provided to support Hong Kongers suffering from Psychosis in the first 2 years after diagnosis. Can cut their suicide rate to 50%

But Hong Kong has 400 shortfall of Psychiatrist with WHO's recommended standard.
Hong Kong Case Manager around 80 patients/Psy.
Overseas progressive countries 10-20 p/p
Children in Hong Kong have to queue up for +1 Yr for diagnosis/treatment

- At-risk pregnant women
- Mothers with postnatal depression (PND)

- Children and families with psychosocial needs
 - Pre-primary children with physical, developmental and behavioural problems
