Development of Primary Care in Hong Kong – Our Issues

In response to the SAR Government's release of the *Strategy Document on Primary Care Development in Hong Kong* in December 2010, on 3 August 2011, our College President invited Dr York Chow, Secretary for Food and Health to a lunch meeting. Participants included Prof Gabriel Leung (Under Secretary for Food and Health), Ms Sandra Lee (Permanent Secretary for Food and Health), Dr PY Lam (Director of Health), Dr PY Leung (CE, Hospital Authority), Dr SV Lo (Director, Strategy & Planning, Hospital Authority), Dr Amy Chiu (Head, Primary Care Office, DH), Dr Betty Young (representing Prof Sian Griffiths, Convenor of the Task Force on Primary Care Conceptual Model and Preventive Protocols), and representatives of our College, namely, Prof NK Leung, Prof L Low, Dr CW Chan, Dr CB Chow and Dr Winnie Tse.

The President expressed our College's stand that children and adolescents are best cared for by paediatricians in the primary, secondary and tertiary health settings that cater to their medical, psychosocial and developmental needs. In the developed countries, it has been well proven that primary care models that capitalize paediatricians' contributions are most cost-effective. Our primary care delivery model thus needs to be embracive and should logically include paediatricians in frontline primary care of children.

Our request to send College representation in the various working groups and task forces on primary care was also expressed at the meeting.

The Primary Care Office of the Department of Health has set up a Primary Care Directory of practitioners involved in providing first-line medical attention to the public. Interested College members may register with the Directory (www.pco.gov.hk). At the meeting, we were reassured that the Directory at present does not carry any bearing on health insurance payments. However, as far as we are aware, for Hospital Authority (HA) staff, only practitioners working in the Accident and Emergency Department and Family Medicine are eligible for registration. HA colleagues working in Paediatrics are not. However, university-employed paediatricians are eligible for registration as they may be providing primary care in their setting.

The College Council will continue to monitor the progress of primary care development for the paediatric age-group and update our colleagues appropriately.

Announcement from Examination Committee

Temporary Relaxation of the 3 MRCPCH Clinical Attempts Regulation

The Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (RCPCH) has implemented a trial relaxation of the 3 clinical attempts regulation in MRCPCH Clinical Examinations. The trial period will begin from October 2011 until February 2012. Under this relaxation rule, candidates are not required to re-sit the Part 2 Written Examination after exhausting their 3 Clinical attempts during this trial period.

Only candidates applying for the MRCPCH 2011/3 & 2012/1 diet of the UK or Overseas examination AND have not attempted the MRCPCH Part 2 examination will be permitted to apply under this relaxation of the regulation. If the candidate has had 3 attempts at the MRCPCH Clinical and has sat the MRCPCH Part 2 Examination, he/she must still pass this Part 2 Examination before being allowed to sit the MRCPCH Clinical Examination again.

Breastfeeding is the unequalled way to providing optimal nutritional, immunological and emotional nurturing for the growth and development of infants, with benefits proportional to its duration and exclusiveness. It is now well-known that early nutrition impacts on long term health, including the predisposition to chronic diseases in adult life. Promoting, supporting and protecting breastfeeding is therefore a public health priority. The Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative (BFHI) has been shown to be an effective intervention to improve breastfeeding rates. To date, there are more than 2000 hospitals worldwide accredited as "Baby-friendly".

For maternal and child healthcare facilities to go mother-baby-friendly, doctors such as obstetricians, paediatricians and family physicians play a crucial role in determining policies and practices. Together with the launch of the Multi-media Self-learning Kit on Breastfeeding, this Capacity Building Programme represents a concerted effort of the Department of Health and leading professional bodies in supporting maternal and child healthcare professionals to work towards mother-baby-friendliness. In this Seminar, Dr. Savage and local experts will expound the scientific evidence and share their experiences in putting theory into practice.

Keynote Speaker: Dr. Felicity Savage

Dr. Savage is a renowned paediatrician in teaching courses in primary care, maternal and child health, and infant and young child feeding in many countries. She has been an Honorary Senior Lecturer at the Institute of Child Health since 1979. She has been closely involved with the Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative since its inception, as a global BFHI assessor, and as a member of the UK BFI Steering Committee. Dr. Savage has been working for the World Health Organisation (WHO), specialising in the promotion of breastfeeding. She has conducted breastfeeding training in many countries. Dr. Savage was part of the team that developed the Global Strategy on Infant and Young Child Feeding, and she edited a number of technical documents on different aspects of breastfeeding for the WHO.




