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Message from the Editors

The age threshold for COVID-19 vaccination has just been lowered to six months, while we are still seeing thousands of new infections locally every day. We may be nowhere near the end of the battle against the novel coronavirus, but we must not despair or let our guards down. In this newsletter, you will find information on two major events, the Joint Annual Scientific Meeting and the Annual General Meeting cum Conferment Ceremony. Remember to mark your diary!

President's Message

In his book "Outliers: The Story of Success", Malcolm Gladwell popularised the concept that elite performers in a discipline will have usually accrued at least 10,000 hours of practice before achieving their level of mastery. How long is 10,000 hours? Assuming that a trainee averages 60 hours per week throughout training and works 48 weeks per year, they reach 10,000 hours by approximately 3.5 years. Unfortunately, things are not so simple. There are many additional requirements that are required before practice transforms a novice into an expert.

First, there must be good quality and timely feedback. The importance of feedback is so great that there is a whole body of research based just on feedback and feedback literacy. This will be explored in more detail in the upcoming Tripartite Medical Education Conference co-organised by HKAM and the Faculties of Medicine of HKU and CUHK. As we develop tools for formative assessments within our new curriculum, we will also need to ensure that our trainers know how to provide timely and good quality feedback to the trainees that they take care of, and that our trainees know how to elicit and learn from feedback in the workplace.

Second, repeated practice will only transform novices into experts if the environment has "high validity", that is to say events in the environment occur with sufficient regularity for predictable patterns to emerge. This means that we need to ensure that trainees spend most of their time in training environments that have been examined for the experience they provide. To this end, we will be conducting our next round of training centre re-accreditation visits in the coming few months.

Third, while repetition and practice are necessary to become an expert, they are insufficient unless in the form of deliberate practice. Simply put, the practice should be deliberately outside one's comfort zone. Once a trainee has achieved "competence" and is comfortable with a task, it is difficult to make further improvements by simply repeating the task. This is the reason we have tiered our new curriculum in a way that will increase the depth of learning as the trainee progresses through the years. The HM Lui Memorial Fund has opened applications for the HM Lui Fellowship for 2023. Overseas rotations in high-validity environments where the trainee is outside their comfort zone offers them valuable opportunities in their path to mastery within their field of choice.

As always, we will continue on multiple fronts to improve our trainees' learning experience and support our Fellows as we strive to serve those under our care.

2022 Best Young Investigator Prize

To encourage research by colleagues, the Best Young Investigator Prize was created in 2015 to be awarded annually to the best paper published between 1st July of previous year and 30th June of the awarding year.

Eligibility

Entry into the Best Young Investigator Prize competition is voluntary.

Applicants must be members of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians (including Associate Members, Members and Fellows) AND aged 46 years or under as at 30 June 2022.

The papers should be published in peer-reviewed print or electronic journals, and written in English or translated into English if they are written in languages other than English.

Only the first author **or** corresponding author is eligible to apply. One paper is eligible for only one submission, and each paper will be allowed to compete for only one prize.

If the paper has previously been awarded the Best Dissertation Prize of the College prior to publication, it will not be eligible for the Best Young Investigator Prize and vice versa.

The decision of the assessment panel will be final.

Submission

Submission deadline for the year 2022 Prize will be <u>15 September 2022</u>. Interested colleagues can email their papers (PDF or MS Word format) together with the Application Form (Appendix I) to the College Secretariat (<u>enquiry@paediatrician.org.hk</u>) <u>on or before 15 September 2022.</u>

The Best Young Investigator Prize will include a cash reward of HK\$5,000 and will be presented during the College 31st Annual Dinner in December 2022.

Announcement from CME Subcommittee

Please note that the current CME/CPD cycle starting on 1 Jan 2020 will <u>end on 31 December 2022</u>. Fellows need to obtain a minimum of 90 points of which 30 points are Category A and 15 points active, to comply with the Academy CME/CPD requirements. Please make sure you will engage enough activities in the remaining months to fulfill the requirement.

If the 2020-2022 cycle is your first CME cycle, you are required to obtain CME points pro-rata to a three-year cycle according to your CME start date. Please note the minimum requirement of individual CME category is waived if the first cycle is shorter than 3 years, so you can obtain CME points from ANY category.

Failure to comply will affect your Academy Fellowship and you will NOT be entitled to remain on the Specialist Register in the Medical Council of Hong Kong. If you have less than 60 CME points, you are NOT entitled for remedial, ending up in immediate removal of your specialist status in MCHK.

If Fellows would like to remain as "Retired Fellow" of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, they need to submit the request to the Academy <u>before the end of this cycle</u>. If not, Fellows are required to complete the Remedial Program in the following year before being accepted as a Retired Fellow of the Academy.

The H M Lui Memorial Fund was established with the generous donation of the Providence Foundation in 2001 to promote postgraduate study and research in liver diseases and related disciplines in children.

Applications are invited for the H M Lui Fellowship, which will be awarded to residents of the Hong Kong SAR who are able to meet the following minimum criteria

The HM Lui Fellowship

The HM Lui Fellowship will be awarded to paediatricians for education, training and research in overseas countries **in any field of Paediatrics**, preferably liver diseases and gastroenterology in the year 2023. Applicants must be aged below 40 years; residents of the Hong Kong SAR and currently working in the Hong Kong SAR.

The award of the Fellowship will consist of:

- 1. Round trip airfare (economy class) by the most economical route.
- 2. Monthly allowance of HK\$12,000-HK\$15,000.
- 3. Reimbursement of course fees and books up to HK\$6,000.

The award of the Fellowship shall range from three (3) to twelve (12) months. Application must be made with nomination by the candidate's Head of the Department of Paediatrics or Hospital Chief Executive. The deadline of application is 30 September 2022.
