This Christmas, instead of celebrating with a festive mood, we stand with and bring solace to those who are in need.

Message from the President

Dear Fellows, Members and Associates,

I am writing this message with a heavy heart. In late November of 2025, the tragic fire in Taipo has devastated the homes of about 2,000 families and claimed more than 150 lives. The importance of humanity and compassion in times of these cannot be overstated. As paediatricians, we are not merely medical professionals but also advocates for the well-being of children and their families. Our commitment to caring for children and their families extends well beyond the hospitals and clinics. It is a calling to stand with our community at this moment of crisis, offering hope and support when it is needed most. Together, we should help heal the broader community and nurture recovery.

A year ago, I addressed you for the first time as the tenth President of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians. The year gone by and we have begun reshaping our College, and would continually to do so, to stay relevant and fit for purpose.

As we recognize that specialist training and education is evolving at a rapid pace, the new curriculum based on competence and outcome has been launched successfully in July 2025 for our trainees. For our trainers, in collaboration with the Jockey Club Institute for Medical Education and Development of the Academy of Medicine, we have organized basic medical education course and targeted train-the-trainer programmes. Subspecialty training programmes has been expanded with completion of the accreditation of eight paediatric subspecialties, the most recent one being the subspecialty of paediatric cardiology.

Resources are essential for development of new initiatives. The Academy of Medicine has agreed to allocate about HK\$1.3 million over a five-year period to our College for important initiatives, which involve the promulgation and capacity building in medical professionalism and ethics, application of genetics and genomics in paediatrics, addressing of the rapid development of artificial intelligence, promotion of well-being of doctors, and review of training curriculum, examination and assessment. Our College shall provide input in the generation of paediatric evidenced-based guidelines with establishment of the Institute for Medical Advancement and Clinical Excellence. Across the border, with development of the Shenzhen-Hong Kong Medical Specialist Training Centre, our College shall

contribute to the development of a structured system for the training of paediatric specialists in Chinese Mainland.

Challenges lie ahead of us. The falling birth rate, the change in the population structure, the reorganization of the territory-wide paediatric services, the consolidation of the hub-and-spoke model with concentration of more paediatric subspecialties at the Hong Kong Children's Hospital prompt us to come up with innovative ideas of nurturing the next generation of paediatricians. Through solidarity and collaboration, new solutions will emerge to guide us forward.

Our College was inaugurated in 1991, and next year marks our 35th anniversary. Let us look forward together to a memorable event next year, where we can reflect on our shared journey and envision continued growth and success for our College.

Honorary Secretary's Report

34th Annual General Meeting, Fellows Conferment Ceremony and Annual Dinner on 6 December 2025

The 34th Annual General Meeting was successfully held on 6 December 2025 at Lim Por Yen Lecture Theatre of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building. The minutes of the 33rd AGM held on 30 November 2024 were endorsed.

This year, the 3-year terms of the three (3) Council Members, namely, Prof LI Chi Kong, Dr LEE Kwok Piu, Dr SO King Woon Alan, came to an end. By the end of the nomination period on 8 September 2025, the College had received four nominations for three Council Member vacancies for the term 2025-2028. A postal ballot was conducted with closing date of 3 November 2025. Dr FU Yu Ming, Dr LI Chak Ho and Dr LUK Chi Kong David were elected as Council Members for the years 2025-2028.

Mr. Kenneth SIT was re-appointed as the College's Honorary Legal Advisor, and Dick Cheng and Company, was appointed as the College's Auditor for year 2026.

The subscription fees for 2026 will remain unchanged, i.e. HK\$2,300 for Fellows, HK1,150 for Overseas Fellows, HK\$1,500 for Members, HK\$750 for Overseas Members, and HK\$800 for Associates. The subscription fee for paediatricians aged 65 or above before 1st January 2026 will continue to be waived.

The Annual General Meeting was followed by the Admission Ceremony of the New Members and the conferment of New Fellows, as well as the Certificate Presentation to the First Fellows of Paediatric Cardiology and Subspecialty New Fellows in Paediatric Endocrinology, Paediatric Neurology, and Paediatric Respiratory Medicine.

We are indebted to Prof Martin WONG, Editor of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, representing Prof Philip LI, President of the Hong Kong Academy Medicine, Dr TO May Kei Liza, Assistant Director of Health of the Department of Health, Dr. Eric CHEUNG, Cluster Chief Executive of the Kowloon Central Cluster, Hospital Authority, the Presidents and representatives of Sister Colleges who graced our day's events with their presence and blessings. It was an evening of honours.

The Annual Dinner was attended by around 140 members of the College and guests. Souvenirs were presented to our three retiring Council Members, namely Prof LI Chi Kong, Dr LEE Kwok Piu and Dr SO King Woon Alan as a token of appreciation for their unwavering contributions to the College. We would also like to take this opportunity to extend our heartfelt wishes to all College members and their families for peace, strength and hope in the coming year.

Faculty and Curriculum Development Committee Support for Workplace-Based Assessment (WBA) Implementation

Nomination for Paediatric-Specific Workplace-Based Assessment (WBA) Course for Trainers on 21 January 2026

Following the collective feedback shared by the training units and the FCDC, a trainer-specific WBA course co-organised by the JCIMED and the FDCD is scheduled for **21 January 2026 (Wednesday)**. This course is part of the initiative at the early stage of the WBA implementation plan, aiming to engage a wider group of trainers to familiarise debriefing and feedback literacy in the WBA workflow in the first half of 2026.

This one-day physical WBA course will accommodate 30 trainers nominated from our training units and will be facilitated by 9 College instructors and 3 faculty members from the Jockey Club Institute for Medical Education and Development (JCIMED) of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.

Thank you once again for training units' continued commitment to WBA implementation and their support for the faculty development of the College.

Protecting Our Youngest Patients: Strengthening Paediatric Advocacy on Seasonal Influenza Vaccination

With the recent increase in severe influenza cases among paediatric patients, we urge all College Fellows and Members to actively encourage seasonal influenza vaccination (SIV) for children and adolescents, especially among children aged 6 months to under 2 years. This age group is particularly susceptible to influenza-related complications, hospitalization, and mortality. Vaccination remains the most effective means of preventing influenza and its serious outcomes.

Paediatricians are the most trusted partners for parents seeking medical advice for their children. We play a pivotal role in advocating for immunisation and addressing parental concerns. Engaging parents through clear communication and reassurance can significantly improve vaccine uptake.

Current Recommendations in Hong Kong

According to the Scientific Committee on Vaccine Preventable Diseases (SCVPD) under the Centre for Health Protection, SIV is recommended for children and adolescents aged 6 months to under 18 years.

Given B/Yamagata lineage viruses are no longer circulating in the population based on WHO surveillance data, both trivalent and quadrivalent vaccines could be used in the 2025-26 season. Inactivated influenza vaccines (IIV) injection is recommended for use among people aged six months of age or older without contraindications. Live attenuated influenza vaccines (LAIV) given intranasally can be used for people aged 2 to 49 years, except those who are pregnant, immunocompromised or with other contraindications.

Children aged 6 months to under 9 years who have not received any SIV before should receive two doses at least four weeks apart.

Vaccine Effectiveness

According to estimates from the United States (US) Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, influenza vaccines reduced the risk of influenza illness by 40% to 60% among the overall population during seasons when most circulating viruses closely matched with the vaccine strains.¹ Making use of local data collected during the 2024-25 season, CHP analysed the relationship between SIV and severe paediatric influenza associated complications and deaths recorded and found that the risk of children aged between 6 months and 17 years who had not received the SIV of this season and subsequently contracted influenza with severe complications or deaths was about 4 times that of the vaccinated children.²

Vaccination Programmes and Access

The Government provides SIV for children through several schemes:

- Government Vaccination Programme (GVP): Free vaccination for eligible children at MCHCs (children aged 6 months to under 2 years) and Hospital Authority clinics (aged 6 months or above).
- Vaccination Subsidy Scheme (VSS): Subsidised vaccination by private doctors for children aged 6 months to under 18 years.
- Seasonal Influenza Vaccination School Outreach Programme (SIVSOP)– outreach teams to kindergartens, child care centres, primary schools, secondary schools and special schools for children and adolescents aged 2 years to under 18 years.

A Call to Action

The College joins the Department of Health in urging all Fellows and Members to actively recommend influenza vaccination to eligible children and families. Your proactive engagement can make a significant difference in reducing severe influenza illnesses and protecting our community's youngest members.

Let us continue to work together to promote a culture of prevention and safeguard the health of Hong Kong's children.
