16th Annual General Meeting

The 16th Annual General Meeting was held on 1st December 2007 at the Lim Por Yen Lecture Theatre of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building. The minutes of the 15th AGM and the Annual Report of the College Council and Standing Committees were received and adopted. Copies of the Annual Report will be sent to those Fellows, Members, and Associates who did not attend the AGM.

Following a postal ballot, Drs Chan Chok Wan, Cheung Pik To and Li Chi Kong were elected as Council Members for a term of three years from 2008 to 2010. Mr Chan Chi Hung and Mr Walter Ma were re-appointed as the College's Honorary Legal Advisor and Honorary Auditor respectively.

Dr Maurice Leung retired as Elected Council Member after many years of invaluable service. The College Council would like to thank him once again for his contribution and continuing support to the College.

Speech by College President in the 16th Annual General Meeting

Professor York Chow, Professor Grace Tang, Professor Felice Lie-mak, Dr KK Kwok, Dr Gloria Tam, Presidents and representatives of Academy Colleges, Fellows, Members, Associates, ladies and gentleman, good evening.

On behalf of the Council of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians, I welcome you all to the New Members Fellows Admission Ceremony of our College. I would like to extend my warmest congratulations to our graduants who will soon be admitted as Members and Fellow of our College. The award of the College Fellowship is your well deserved reward after your many years of hard work. This joyous occasion will be an important milestone in your life after your graduation from medical school. While rejoicing in your success, you should be grateful to the support of your family and to the patients, parents, colleagues and mentors who have provided you with such an excellent learning environment so that you could achieve the knowledge, skills and attitude to become a competent paediatrician. You have entered into the paediatric profession in an opportune moment. Those of you who plan to enter into private practice are relieved to know that the Hong Kong's economy has improved in recent times after many years of recession. It is the College's opinion that qualified paediatricians are the only ideal primary care doctors looking after children and young people in our community. Our paediatric colleagues in practice face stiff competition from general practitioners and specialists in family medicine who also claim that they are the most appropriate primary care doctors for children. It is therefore up to you all to demonstrate to the parents and children and to educate the community that only qualified paediatricians can provide the best value for money, evidence-based holistic care for children. The Intermediate and Exit examinations only assess your knowledge and skills to ascertain that you are competent to practise paediatrics. Although attitude is extensively included in our training curriculum, we practically never assess our trainees on this very important aspect. Whether doctors have appropriate attitudes towards professionalism, has been shown to affect their relationships with patients, the quality of care they provide and ultimately, health and illness outcomes. Your success in practice will depend in your attitude towards professionalism. What then is a good professional behaviour:

1. Integrity and adherence to a high moral code are necessary aspects of professionalism.

2. You should always make the care of your patients your primary concern (altruism) and act as the advocate for children.

3. Be aware of the importance of empathy and effective communication.

4. To demonstrate the appropriate demeanour, attire and conduct.

5. There is consensus on the importance of reflective practice, audit and keeping ones professional knowledge and skills up-to-date and hence the importance of your participation in CPD. A good doctor is one who is committed to life-long self-directed learning. Interactive educational activities in continuing education are more effective in changing doctors' behaviour and performance and improvement in patient care. From January 2008 onwards, a Fellow of the Academy is require to accumulate 15 active CME/CPD points within the 3-year CME cycle.

Our College has pledged that we will provide adequate active CPD activities for Fellows to fulfil this Academy CPD requirement. For those of you who aspire to continue your practice in the public sector or to train further in a paediatric subspecialty, exciting times lie ahead of you. Our College has invited applications for accreditation of different paediatric subspecialty training programmes in Hong Kong. The Chief Executive has the vision to include in his policy address, the decision to explore the possibility of establishing a centre of excellence in paediatrics in Hong Kong. A vision without action is but a dream. It is up to us all, especially those of you who continue to work in the public sector, to work together to make his dream become a reality. Hong Kong deserves a Children Hospital.

Finally, my congratulations to our granduants again. Thank you.

Hong Kong College of Paediatricians Foundation Medical Mission Trip to Yunnan for Year 2008

The itinerary is as follows:-

25th May, 2008	Depart from Hong Kong to Kunming
26th – 27th May, 2008	Neonatal Resuscitation Program in Kunming Maternal and Child Health

28th – 31st May, 2008	Depart for Shangri-La, seminar, site visit and tour of Shangri-La.
1st June, 2008	Return to Hong Kong via Kunming

The cost for airfare, lodging and breakfast quoted by China Travel Agency, exclusive of tips and miscellaneous items is about \$5,080.00 - \$5,480.00 per person depending on the choice of Hotel. This will include the use of tour bus over the whole trip. Meals and local tours are not included as there will be official dinners and the local officials may help us arrange for local tours.

We welcome College Fellows to join us as appointed teachers (Mandarin speaking an essential, preferably with experience in NRP). Hong Kong College of Paediatricians Foundation will subsidize the cost of travel and lodging for the appointed teachers.

H. M. LUI Memorial Fund

The Hong Kong College of Paediatricians established the H. M. LUI Memorial Fund in Year 2001 to promote postgraduate study and research in liver diseases and related disciplines in children.

Applications are invited for the H.M. LUI Fellowship, which will be awarded to residents of Hong Kong SAR who are able to meet the following minimum criteria:

THE H. M. LUI FELLOWSHIP

The H. M. LUI Fellowship will be awarded to paediatricians for education, training and research in the United Kingdom **in any field of Paediatrics**, preferably liver diseases and gastroenterology in the year 2008. The applicant must be aged below 40 years; Residents of Hong Kong SAR and are currently working in Hong Kong SAR.

The award of the Fellowship will consist of:

- 1. Round trip airfare (economy class) by the most economical route.
- 2. Monthly allowance of HK\$10,000-HK\$12,000.
- 3. Reimbursement of course fees and books up to HK\$6,000.

The award of the Fellowship shall range from three (3) to twelve (12) months. <u>Application must be</u> made by nomination by the Head of the Department of Paediatrics or Hospital Chief Executive. The deadline of application is 29th February, 2008.
