### Press Conference: Stop smoking for our children's sake

In response to the World Stop Smoking Day, our College held a press conference on 29th May 2002 jointly with the Hong Kong Paediatric Society and the Hong Kong Society of Paediatric Respirology. Our stand was presented by Prof NK Leung and our proposal by Dr Alfred Tam. Both statements can be found in Appendix I.

### **PALS Course 2002**

The Paediatric Advanced Life Support Course will be held from 17th to 21st July 2002 at the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building. In addition to Dr Alfred Hu Young and Dr David Jaimovich, Dr Arno Zaritsky, editor of the new PALS course content, and Director of the Division of Pediatric Critical Care at the University of Florida Medical Center will also be our overseas speaker.

## From the CME Subcommittee

### **Category D points**

MCQ exercise of Hong Kong Journal of Paediatrics: The Hong Kong Journal of Paediatrics (new series) has been increased to 4 issues per year. The Education Committee has decided to keep the same CME point awards (i.e. 4 Category D points) for doing the MCQ exercise per issue. However, Fellows are reminded that there is a maximum of 10 points that a Fellow can claim for Category D points each year.

#### Journal Self-Study:

Fellows are reminded that they can get Category D CME points through journal reading but the existing CME guidelines require the following conditions to be fulfilled before Category D points can be awarded:

1. There is a list of paediatric journals already approved for self study (see list below). Other journals in paediatrics or paediatric subspecialties, or paediatric-related articles in other referred journals (index medicus) will also be accepted but

- prior application in writing to the CME Subcommittee is required.
- 2. Only articles published within the past one year will be accepted.
- 3. One point will be awarded to each journal article studied when a written commentary of about 300 words is submitted.
- 4. A maximum of 10 Category D points can be gained each year.
- 5. An annual assessment fee, currently \$500, is required for this activity.

### Press Conference: Stop smoking for our children's sake

#### Presented by Prof. Nai-kong Leung

(On behalf of Hong Kong College of Paediatricians, the Hong Kong Paediatric Society and the Hong Kong Society of Paediatric Respirology)

#### **Our Stand**

- 1. We denounce tobacco smoking in any environment with children because of its effects on the child's health and future.
- 2. Our research, coupled with data generated from overseas, have revealed convincing evidence that second hand smoking causes overwhelming effects on children.
- 3. Such effects pose a highly significant burden on our health care system, not to mention the economic effects on the rest of the family.
- 4. We therefore urge the Government, medical and health professionals, and the public to pay special attention to the effects of smoking on children.
- 5. We support the Government's attempts to ban smoking in all public places and in-door environments where children are present.
- 6. We urge all medical professionals to join hands in persuading smoking parents to quit smoking for their children's sake, and be alert to the possible effects of passive smoking on children's health.
- 7. We are deeply concerned about the rising numbers of teenage smokers in Hong Kong, and feel that the Government and the public should join hands to prevent young people from starting to smoke. This would require serious efforts to counteract the effects of advertisements targeting at young people.
- 8. We are aware that the smoking cessation clinics run by the Hospital Authority are providing valuable help to adults who want to quit smoking. But for those teenagers who may want to quit, these clinics may not be able to cater to their styles and needs.

### Our Proposal

- 1. We urge the Government, the Legislative Council, and all other bodies concerned to make it possible to ban smoking in all public places and in-door environments including restaurants, so as to minimise the effect of passive smoking on children.
- 2. The 3 bodies have collaborated to form a Paediatric Anti-smoking Task Force to look into the matter. 'A Doctor's Anti-smoking Kit' will be prepared to help doctors understand the magnitude of the problem, and to help them to present the case of quitting smoking to the parents. All doctors who take care of children would be asked to participate.
- 3. We also urge the Government and public bodies concerned to pay special attention to the effects of tobacco advertisements on teenagers, and to institute attempts to counteract such effects.
- 4. Efforts should also be made to help teenagers to quit smoking if they so wish. We would urge the Government to establish special smoking cessation clinics for teenagers as this group of individuals require different approaches and treatment methods apart from adult smokers.

## Hong Kong College of Paediatricians H. M. LUI Memorial Fund

The Hong Kong College of Paediatricians established the H. M. LUI Memorial Fund in Year 2001 to promote postgraduate study and research in liver diseases and related disciplines in children.

Applications are invited for the H.M. LUI Fellowship, which will be awarded annually to those who are able to meet the following minimum criteria:

#### THE H. M. LUI FELLOWSHIP

The H. M. LUI Fellowship will be awarded to paediatricians (or medical graduates) of ethnic Chinese origin aged below 40 years, including but not exclusive of the residents of Hong Kong SAR and of the Mainland of China, for education, training and research in the United Kingdom in paediatric hepatology in Year 2002-2003.

The award of the Fellowship will consist of:

- 1. An air passage by the most economical route.
- 2. Monthly allowance of HK\$10,000.
- 3. Reimbursement of course fees and books up to HK\$6,000.

The award of the Fellowship shall be for a period of six months. <u>Application</u> must be made by nomination by the head of the department. The deadline of application is 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2002.

#### Sample format

- 1. The frame of the abstract must form a rectangle 18 cm in height x 25 cm in width;
- 2. Type wholly within the box frame;
- 3. Type in 12 point size Times New Roman font, with single-line spacing in the boxes provided;
- 4. The title should be informative and as specific as possible. The title should be in capitals and at the top of the abstract. The length of the title must not exceed 170 characters;
- 5. Avoid using abbreviations in the title; only the total should be typed in bold;
- 6. Do not use full-stops / periods at the end of the title, names or institution address;
- 7. Type name(s) of author(s) with initials first (e.g. JKC Peterson); use sentence case but do not use any full-stops / periods and do not italicize; underline the name of the presenting author (which should be identical with the name as entered on the Registration Form), even if there is only one author. The presenting author's name should be followed by full postal address;
- 8. Type the details of the institution on the line immediately after the names;
- 9. The abstract should be informative, including the study objectives, materials and methods, results and conclusions. Uninformative statement, such as "results will be discussed" should be avoided;
- 10. Tables, figures and graphs are permitted, but within the space allocated and they must be of high clarity print;
- 11. Do not use double spaces at the end of sentences do not add lines of space between paragraphs;
- 12. Define abbreviations at their first mention; spell out numbers less than 10, unless followed by units of measurement. Special or unusual abbreviations must be placed in parentheses after the first use of the first word;
- 13. Do not erase. Remember the abstract will appear in print exactly as you submit it. Any erasure, smudge, error or misspelling will be glaringly apparent in the published abstracts;
- 14. Failure to comply with these requirements will exclude the abstract from consideration;
- 15. If submitting by email, please save the file as an **MS-WORD.doc** or **.rtf** format and then send as an attachment to: <a href="mailto:leung2142@cuhk.edu.hk">leung2142@cuhk.edu.hk</a>.
