
# From the Examination Committee

### MRCPCH/MRCP (UK) Part II Examination in Paediatrics:

We would like to announce a number of changes to the Part II examination of the MRCPCH/MRCP (UK) Examination in Paediatrics from May 2001.

- The written examination will be separated from the clinical examination. A pass in the written examination will allow the candidate to take the clinical exam up to three times within two years before having to retake the written examination. This will reduce the number of times candidates have to retake the written examination even if they are unsuccessful in the clinical examination.
- The number of questions in the written examination will be increased.
- The period of training requirements (more than 2½ years from graduation, minimum of 12 months involving emergency paediatric care within last 5 years) will apply to the time when the clinical examination is taken. Candidates will be able to take the Part II Written Examination at any time after they have passed the Part I Examination.
- The dates of the written examination have been altered to allow candidates who have passed the written exam more time to arrange to take the clinical examination. In 2001 there will be 4 written papers to avoid these changes possibly hindering candidate's career plans.

# Survey on Use of Internet among Paediatricians

PGA Committee performed a questionnaire survey on the above issue in November 2000. The response was encouraging. A total of 553 questionnaires were sent out by fax. We received 151 replies (27%) in 4 weeks. Of all the respondents, 84% are our College Fellows. 11% are our Members and 5% are our Associates. 45% are working in Public Hospitals. 42% are working in Private Sector. 7% are working in Department of Health and 6% are working in Universities. The results of the survey are enlisted as below:
