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Congratulations!!

Three prominent Fellows of our College have been awarded 'Outstanding Paediatricians of Asia' by The Association of Pediatric Societies of the Southeast Asian Region at the recent Asian Congress of Paediatrics held in Taipei.

Dr. Chan Chok Wan was honoured for his leadership in many innovative projects which established major medical societies in Hong Kong; for his dedicated service and participation as advisor to many local voluntary agencies dealing with children and their parents; and for his outstanding contribution to the advancement of knowledge in paediatrics and to the betterment of child health.

Dr. Leung Nai Kong was honoured for his unwavering commitment to paediatric education, research and practice throughout his career, which specifically provided structured training programs for all pediatric trainees in Hong Kong; and for providing outstanding contribution to community services for the handicapped and children suffering from cancer.

Dr. Yeung Chap Yung was honoured for his significant contribution to medical education including curricular reforms; for his establishment of Paediatric Units and a Child Rehabilitation Research Center; for his untiring researches especially in neonatology and herbal medicine which have led to marked improvement of child health and prevention of disease in China; and for his professional and academic achievements in fostering scholarships among the universities of Hong Kong, China and other Asian countries.

Critical Appraisal Workshop 27-30 April 2000

Our College, in conjunction with the Hospital Authority, will organize a training course for trainers and trainees in Paediatrics. The course will be conducted by Dr Stuart Logan, Director, Systematic Reviews Training Unit, Institute of Child Health, London. The training course for trainers is for Fellows of the College, who would like to acquire the skill in interpreting the data in the ever-increasing medical publications. The course for trainees is

intended for those trainees who will be sitting for their Exit Assessment in which Critical Appraisal is an integral part. The course will be conducted at the Hospital Authority Head Office at 147B, Argyle Street, Kowloon on 27-28 April (trainees' course) and 29-30 April (trainers' course). Course fee is HK\$1,000 which will be exempted for HA and honorary HA staff who will be subsidized by the Hospital Authority. **CME points** will be awarded: Category A 2 points for each half-day, i.e. 8 points for the whole course. To all COSs:

The Council has resolved that Chiefs of Service of local training institutions accredited by the College should submit a list of new trainees to the College Secretariat every 6 months, i.e. every January and July. A nil return is required.

To all trainees:

The Council has resolved that after 30th June 2000, a maximum grace period of 6 months delay in the application for Associateship or Membership would be allowed by the College. If the delay in time of joining training in a local accredited institution and the time of the submission of application for Associateship exceeds 6 months, accreditation of the trainee's basic paediatric training will only start from the date that the application is lodged. If an Associate fails to apply to become a Member of the College within six months of the date that he/she is eligible for Membership, the his/her Higher Training will only be accredited from the date when the application for Membership is submitted.

GUIDELINES FOR EXIT ASSESSMENT

A. Areas of Assessment:

The assessment consists of 4 parts:

- (1) For dissertations:
 - (a) 4 papers are required, with one from each of the following 3 categories:
 - (i) research project/study
 - (ii) reviews of literature of a clinical problem
 - (iii) case report

however, full research/study (not approved protocols, or unfinished studies) can replace any one of the other two categories.
 - (b) For papers on research project/study, reviewing of cases of a condition is acceptable but the candidate must be the first author. For published research project/study and approved protocols of which the candidate is not the first author, he/she should have ***a significant contribution (at least 40%)*** to the project/study, and certification by the first author and supervisor is required. Unfinished research projects are acceptable.
 - (c) For ***Review of literature*** and Case reports, the candidate must be the first author.
 - (d) No two papers should be of the same topic.
 - (e) Candidates are advised not to submit more than 4 papers. If so, he/she would be requested to choose 4 papers for assessment.
 - (f) No papers after deadline for application will be accepted, and candidates will not be able to present themselves for the Assessment.
 - (g) For re-sitting of the Assessment, previously submitted dissertations (with or without revision) can be used.
- (2) For Clinical Experience/Competence
Candidates would be assessed on the approach to problem formulation and clinical management, more than on book-knowledge and minute details. They would be assessed on their clinical judgement and competence in dealing with clinical problems.
- (3) For Service Related Issues
Candidates would be assessed on how their clinical experience enables them in handling service related matters, e.g. medical legal problems, ethical issues, risk management, communication skills, doctor-patient relationship, clinical audit, quality assurance programmes, training and supervision of staff, etc.
- (4) For Critical Paper Appraisal
Candidates will be assessed on how to read a paper regarding methodology, evaluation of results and clinical relevance.

B. Format:

Duration: - 60 minutes for reading a paper selected from a recent journal for appraisal (to discuss with assessors during assessment)
- about 50 minutes for assessment in the form of an interview by 3 assessors

Assessors: each candidate will be assessed by 3 assessors among whom there is a senior assessor; for the part on clinical competence he/she will be interviewed by all 3 assessors, and the senior assessor will review the higher training program of the candidate; and the other parts will be assessed by 2 of the 3 assessors

Assessment Schedule:

Clinical competence	(15 minutes)	3 assessors*
Service provision issues	(10 minutes)	2 assessors
Dissertation	(20 minutes)	2 assessors
Critical appraisal of a scientific paper	(10 minutes)	2 assessors

* candidate's clinical experience during higher training will be reviewed by the senior assessor

C. Marking:

(a) Each part will be marked by an agreed score from the 3 assessors as:

5	for excellence
4	for good pass
3	for pass
2	for failure
1	for bad failure

(b) Total score and mark as a percentage of 100:

Clinical competence and dissertation have more weighting constituting 30% each, and service provision issues and critical paper appraisal of 20% each. Thus, scores for clinical competence and dissertation will be multiplied by a factor of 6, and scores for service provision and critical paper appraisal by a score of 4, to make up a total score to be converted as a percentage of 100.

D. Passing the assessment

Grade A	85 - 100
Grade B	70 - 84
Grade C	55 - 69
Grade D	40 - 54
Grade E	below 40

Candidates who score Grade A, B, and C pass the assessment, provided he/she has not scored a bad failure in any one of the four parts. Those who score Grade D fail the assessment, and score Grade E fail it badly.

EXIT ASSESSMENT OF THE HONG KONG COLLEGE OF PAEDIATRICIANS

1. The Exit Assessment for Members for consideration of elevation to Fellowship of the College will be held twice a year in June and December. Only Members who would have completed their Higher Training by 30th June or 31st December would be allowed to apply for the Exit Assessment in June and December respectively.
2. With effect from the 1st October 1998, Members of the College who have completed their three years of Higher Training and any medical practitioners registered in Hong Kong who have acquired the necessary qualifications (Appendix I), experiences and training recognized by the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians for higher training in paediatrics will have to sit and pass the Exit Assessment of the College before consideration of elevation to the Fellowship of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians.
3. The Exit Assessment would take the form of an oral assessment without a clinical examination and each assessment will usually not last for more than an hour.
4. The Board of Examiners will be appointed by the College for each candidate and will consist of three assessors who are not trainers/supervisors of the candidate during his/her higher training.
5. Deadline of Application: 15.04.2000
6. Assessment Fee: HK\$4,000
7. Application forms are available from The Secretariat of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians (Tel: 2871 8871/Fax: 2785 1850), and applications should be returned to the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians, Room 808, Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Hong Kong.
8. The completed application form should be submitted with:
 - (i) Certified true copies of certificates
 - (ii) 2 photographs certified by one of the proposers
 - (iii) 4 dissertations with one from each of the following categories:
 - a) research project
 - b) critical review of a clinical problem
 - c) case reportdissertations comprising only of original research or critical review are also acceptable.
 - d) for candidates re-sitting the Exit Assessment, the previously submitted dissertations with revision can be used.
 - (iv) Log sheets of higher training and assessment by Trainers and Supervisors
 - (v) A cheque of \$4,000.00 for the Exit Assessment made payable to the "Hong Kong College of Paediatricians".
9. A receipt would be issued upon submission of an application but only applications with the complete submissions of documents required elaborated in point 8 would be processed.
