## Special features of Adolescent Medicine (AM) in Hong Kong

- \* There are areas of services taken care of by non-medical agencies e.g. substance abuse
- \* Local cultural context in Adolescent Medicine

## Adolescent Medicine (AM)

\* Young persons in Adolescent Medicine Clinic are small in numbers but they need intensive therapy and support

## HKCH

- \* Phase I (2016 2024) Oncology / Cardiology / Renal / PICU with no direct admission from Emergency Department
- \* Phase II (after 2024) Fully operating HKCH with Emergency Department in the New Acute Hospital right next to it

## Existing adolescent medicine services

- \* adolescent medicine clinics
- \* QEH Adolescent Medical Centre (AMC) was started in 1995 with multi-disciplinary approach providing one-stop holistic care for teenagers aged 12 - 19
- \* Team members: paediatricians, psychologists, psychiatrists, nurse practitioners, medical social workers, dietitians, occupational therapists

- \* Paediatricians providing services in HA adolescent clinics

## Existing clinical services

### Outpatient services

- \* Eating Disorder
- Anxiety and mood disorder
  - +/- suicidal idea
  - +/- school refusal
- Multiple psychosomatic complaints
- Healthcare transition for young persons with chronic illnesses
- Social skills problems or suspected autistic spectrum disorder
- \* Obesity
- Behavioural or family problems e.g.
   violent behaviour

### Inpatient services

- \* Eating disorder
  - Newly diagnosed
  - Chronic anorexia nervosa (AN) cases with repeated admissions
  - Critically ill AN requiring PICU care
- Suicidal attempt
- Substance abuser with acute intoxication and PICU admission
- \* Aggressive behaviour

# ADOLESCENT MEDICINE TRAINING - GENERAL PAEDIATRICS AND SUBSPECIALTY

## Adolescent Medicine Training

Adolescent medicine training aims at providing a cross discipline experience for trainees in both clinical medicine, mental health service and psychosocial service



# Clearly defined roles of adolescent physician

- Medical Expert in providing healthcare for adolescent population with the following roles:
  - Professional
  - \* Scholar
  - Advocate
  - Collaborator



# Training venues for subspecialty trainees

- \* Adolescent Medical Centre / QEH
- \* Eating disorder service network
- \* Community adolescent services providers e.g. mother's choice, non-government organisations for adolescents e.g. hostels or detox program for substance abuser

# AM Training for general paediatric residents

- \* Communication skills training integrated into the MRCPCH training course for pre-member residents
- \* Teaching sessions on core topics in adolescent medicine e.g. puberty, eating disorder, healthcare transition, sexuality, sexually transmitted infection, contraception, LGBTQ healthcare, psychosomatic complaints, adolescents high risk behaviors e.g. alcohol, e-cigarette, bullying, family violence
- \* Short <u>attachment</u> to community services e.g. Mother's Choice, CCDS
- \* Electives to Adolescent Medicine in AMC / QEH

## AM Subspecialty Training

- \* 3 year program
- Allow 1 year overlap with higher trainee of the HKCPaed general paediatrics fellowship program
- Rotations to Child Psychiatry, Clinical Psychology, Endocrinology
- Dissertation and written examination at exit
- \* In-training assessment included in the final exit examination
- \* Maximum 6 months of recognition for specified qualification or training within the subspecialty training program e.g. Ph.D, MPH

### Future Adolescent Medicine programs

Healthcare transition program for youth with chronic illnesses

General adolescent medicine clinic

e.g. family problems, bullying, anxiety, suicide and sexual health

Eating disorder service network
Eating disorder day hospital

Transgender care program

Obesity program

No Young Families Program or Substance Abuse Program in HKCH

\* Adolescent friendly Hong Kong Children's Hospital



# Eating Disorder Inpatient Program at SickKids

- \* The only inpatient beds directly under the care of adolescent physicians are the 10 inpatient beds for adolescents with anorexia nervosa
- \* All staff physicians have 2-week rotations to take care of the 10 inpatient eating disorder beds

## Phase 1 (2016 - 2024) What to do with each program?

- Eating Disorder Service Network
- Healthcare transition for adolescents with chronic illnesses
  - \* Starts with spina bifida patients and then expand the service according to need
- \* Transgender (TG) healthcare interest group
  - Transgender healthcare network
- \* Continuous improvement in general adolescent medicine service mental health, psychosocial health and sexuality aspects
- \* Obesity Program similar to SickKids Team Obesity Management Program (STOMP) at SickKids; focus on psychosocial intervention before the expertise for bariatric surgery is available

## Summary

### **Training**

- \* Accreditation of subspecialty training
- \* Research in local community
- \* Spread the knowledge of adolescent medicine to undergraduate, general pediatric and general public



### Manpower

- Attract trainees
- Promotion of Adolescent
   Medicine as a well-defined subspecialty

## What to do in phase 1?

### 2016 - 2024

- Accreditation of subspecialty training
- Liaise with other units for future AM training programs
  - Endocrinology
  - Child Psychiatry
  - Psychologist
  - Community Service Providers
- Research in local adolescent population

### After 2024

- \* 5 adolescent programs to better serve our younger generation
- Adolescent physicians play the role of professional, scholar, advocate and collaborator for adolescents in Hong Kong
