Developmental-Behavioural Paediatrics Subspecialty Training Programme
Information for Application

Subspecialty Description

Developmental-Behavioural Paediatrics (DBP) is a discipline of Paediatrics that deals with the evaluation, treatment and management of children with or at risk for developmental, learning, emotional and behavioural problems, through an understanding of the underlying biological and social factors, and delivered in context of the children's lives and families. It emphasizes evidence based practice, multidisciplinary and cross sector collaboration, and aims to promote the optimal development and behavioural health of all children.

Intake for Training Programme

This invitation is for the DBP training programme that has commenced on 1st December, 2013. The training programme cycle normally begins in January and July. Invitations for the training programme may be issued around January and July for subsequent cycles. Training Programmes for accepted candidates will commence when training resources can be confirmed.

Eligibility

- Specialists holding the qualification of FHKAM (Paediatrics) or its equivalent, or
- Candidates who have completed 3 years basic training in general paediatrics and have passed the Joint MRCPCH(HK)/Hong Kong College of Paediatricians Intermediate Examination are eligible to receive up to a maximum of one cumulated year of DBP subspecialty training experience during their higher training in general paediatrics, subject to prior approval of the proposed training by the DBP Subspecialty Board;
- Fluency in spoken Cantonese and basic level of written Chinese.

Duration of training

This is a 3-year training programme, with a maximum of one cumulated year of training received during Higher Training in general paediatrics, subject to approval of the DBP Subspecialty Board.
