# *Report* **President's**

The College of Paediatricians has gone through the "infancy period" and is now ready for the next stage of development. Lots of ground-work have been laid down by our Foundation and early Fellows awaiting the participation of all of us to build on further. Much work still needs to be done. The various activities of the College in the past year can be found in the reports of the respective committees. I would highlight only three areas of special interest in this report.

First of all, our College has entered into an agreement with the Royal Colleges of Physicians of U.K. and the Hong Kong College of Physicians to hold Joint Examinations starting 1994. In my inaugural address, I have already pointed out our informal negotiations with our U.K. counterparts. These have led to a more formal discussion with the London College when the Joint Scientific Meeting was held in Hong Kong over a year ago. In March this year, Prof. D. Todd, Prof. T.K. Chan and I were invited by the U.K. Royal Colleges to London for further talks. This has resulted in the "Memorandum of Agreement" reached by all parties to commence a joint "HK/UK MRCP examination" next year.

The format of the examination will remain the same as it has been since 1985, i.e. local examiners will continue to host and take part in the clinical examinations alongside with examiners from U.K. In the new system, Hong Kong examiners will be involved in the clinical examinations conducted in U.K., besides contributing to question-setting in the written examinations. Hong Kong will also be formally represented in the Examination and Review Boards of both the Part I and Part II examinations. The Hong Kong Colleges are currently considering awarding some kind of certificates to candidates who are successful in this new Joint Examination. This new arrangement will ensure not only the standard of our future examinations but also the international standing of our future members.

Another significant activity is establishing links with sister Colleges. We have a number of functions held jointly with, the Hong Kong Paediatric Society and the Hong Kong College of Physicians. With the Paediatric Society, a couple of joint scientific meetings were held, an international meeting will be held next December and a joint statement to clarify "The Vitamin K Controversies" has been made. Annual joint meeting was also held with the Hong Kong College of Physicians and the Royal Colleges. Our College has also been invited to participate in a number of international scientific meetings. We organized a symposium on "Child health problems in new immigrants of Chinese origin" at the Canadian Paediatric Society Annual

Meeting in Vancouver last June. We also participated in giving plenary and symposia lectures in the Annual Scientific Meeting of the Chapter of Paediatricians of the Singapore Academy of Medicine.

Thirdly, on the development of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, an Inaugural Meeting will be held on 9th December this year. An office has been allotted to us in the temporary accommodation of the Academy at the Pamela Youde Nethersole Eastern Hospital. We are planning to build new facilities for the Academy in the near future.

All in all, it has been a busy but fruitful year. I thank all my colleagues/council members and many fellow-members and friends who have contributed to College affairs in various capacities this year. I am also grateful to Mr Peter Mark and Mr Walter Ma for their respective legal and auditing professional services in an honorary capacity. The College will count on you all for support and active participation before she can progress further and achieve her various objectives.

# **Honorary Secretary's**

The College was in the second year after its formation. Important ground work was laid down for future development and links were developed overseas.

## **Qualifying Examination**

One of the main functions of the College is to hold examination to qualify paediatricians in Hong Kong. Since the College is new, overseas links and recognition are considered important. Our College together with the Hong Kong College of Physicians undertook an agreement with the three Royal Colleges of Physicians of United Kingdom to hold Joint Examination in Hong Kong such that our local trainees on passing the examination, would be awarded both our local accreditation and the UK Membership. The Joint Examination is planned to begin in 1994 and will be held twice a year.

## **Foundation Fellows of the Academy of Medicine**

The Hong Kong Academy of Medicine would be inaugurated in December 1993. According to the admission criteria laid down by the Academy, a total of 228 were recommended to be Foundation Fellows for the Academy's consideration.

## **Educational Programmes and Joint Conferences**

Four Teach-in Sessions were organized in conjunction with Paediatric Postgraduate Programme of the Hospital Services and lectures were delivered by visiting guest speakers. A Joint Scientific Meeting with the Hong Kong College of Physicians was held on 23 October 1992 at Sheraton Hotel. Another Scientific Meeting jointly organized with the Hong Kong Paediatric Society was held on 11 March 1993 at Omni Hong Kong Hotel, which included a poster session as well. A delegate of six from our College participated in the Annual Meeting of the Canadian Paediatric Society held in June and presented in a special session. In August, the Chapter of Paediatricians of the Academy of Medicine of Singapore, and Singapore Paediatric Society held a Scientific Meeting "Child Health Towards 2000" with the participation of our College. Four of our Fellows were invited as speakers.

## **Membership**

In 1993, we welcomed another 10 Fellows, 30 Members and 3 Associates, bringing our numbers up to 195 Fellows 94 Members and 10 Associates.

We are grateful to our Honorary Legal Advisor, Mr Peter Mark and Honorary Auditor Mr Walter Ma for their valuable assistance.

It had been a fruitful year. With the hardwork and support of many, the College was beginning to grow.

## **Honorary Treasurer's**

As can be seen from the Statement of Income and Expenditure, the last financial year ended with a healthy surplus of HK\$71,706.65.

We are grateful to the various donors listed in the Statement for their generous support of the many College functions.

A word of explanation is in order for the amount of subscription collected. It represents the amount collected during the last financial year and therefore includes part of the 1992 and part of the 1993 subscriptions.

I am pleased to say that, up to the time of writing this report, all our Fellows, except two who have left Hong Kong and one who resigned, have paid their subscription. All our Members except one have paid their subscription. One Associate resigned during the year and two still have their subscription outstanding. I hope this report will serve as yet another reminder for them to send in their subscription.

May I take this opportunity to urge all our Fellows, Members and Associates to make use of the Direct Debit Authorization arrangement. It will save you the trouble of remembering to send in your subscription and will save us the trouble of doing a great deal of follow-up correspondence.

There had been some technical problems with the Autodebit Payment System in the last two years. The delay was mainly for your protection. Our banker has now advised us that the Hong Kong Association of Banks has recommended a new system which would become effective from 2nd August, 1993. Hopefully, it should function more efficiently from now on.

Finally before I conclude, I should like to thank our Hon. Auditor, Messrs, Walter Ma and Company, for preparing the Financial Statements and auditing our Accounts once again so expeditiously.

This committee had six meetings between September 1992 to September 1993 and continued the process of drafting accreditation recommendations to the Council of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians under the following headings:

- (a) Process of accreditation of local institutions (application forms; verification; inspection and lines of communication).
- (b) Revision of guidelines for basic training (workload of trainees - number of patients; frequency of call; mix of subspecialties under a flexible modular system; ratio of trainers to trainees).
- (c) Accreditation of overseas institutions for basic training on an ad hominem basis.
- (d) Accreditation of a local institution for advanced training in general paediatrics (duration of accreditable periods; level of supervision; trainer trainee ratio; service load; facilities).
- (e) Accreditation of training in Department of Health Units and other HA units - (Clinical Genetics, Child Assessment, Maternal and Child Health, Paediatric Surgery, Accident and Emergency).
- (f) Accreditation of a local institution for advanced training in subspecialties (this is still under discussion).







1. COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE AND NOT HAVING A SHARE CAPITAL

The Company, Hong Kong College of Paediatricians was incorporated under the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance, (Chapter 32) as a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital on 8th May, 1991.
