

1993/94 has been a busy year for the College. The most significant event was the Inauguration of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine in December 1993. As a Foundation College, we recommended 224 Fellows to be admitted as Foundation Fellows of the Academy during the admission ceremony. Subsequently, more College Fellows were added to the list of Academy Foundation Fellowship.

Since 1985, the Hong Kong University Department of Paediatrics, in collaboration with the Medical & Health Department of the Hong Kong Government, has been co-ordinating and hosting the paediatric MRCP (UK) examination. In October 1993, jointly with the Hong Kong College of Physicians, our College entered into an agreement with the three UK Royal Colleges to hold a joint examination twice yearly commencing February 1994. Candidates who are successful at the Examination are awarded two diplomas, the MRCP (UK) and a Certificate of Passing the Intermediate Examination of our College. Two appointed co-ordinators (Prof. T.K. Chan and Prof. C.Y. Yeung), in collaboration with the Hospital Authority, have provided administrative support for this examination.

Our College is also formally represented at the MRCP Examination Boards. At present, Dr. M.C. Chiu and Prof. C.Y. Yeung are the Part I and Part II Board representatives, respectively, with the arrangement to be assessed after two years.

With the help of many fellows, our Education Committee has nearly finished revising on the "Education objectives" for our local paediatric training programmes. These will go before the Academy Education Committee for approval before implementation.

Our Accreditation Committee has just completed its first round of visits to local hospital paediatric units. The preliminary findings will form the basis of our recommendation for future accreditation for the three basic years of the paediatric training. For the first time in the history of Hong Kong Paediatrics, guidelines on training and accreditation of hospital and individual programmes will be drawn up to ensure proper training of local paediatricians.

Besides continuing with the post-graduate paediatric training course for hospital trainees, we

have also organised a couple of special scientific meetings. Joint meetings were held with the Hong Kong College of Physicians in October 1993, and with the Hong Kong Paediatric Society in December 1993 and June 1994 respectively.

The December meeting on "Neonatal Jaundice" and the "College Forum" deserve some special mention. The meeting coincided with the Inauguration of the Academy and was very well attended. International authorities on neonatal jaundice, including Prof. R. Wennberg, Prof. T. Valaes, Prof. K.L. Tan and other well-respected workers in the Asian region, addressed the gathering. The President of the Australian Paediatric Society, Dr. Peter Procopis, the President of the British Paediatric Association, Prof. Roy Meadow, the President of Chinese Paediatric Association, Prof. Ziang Zaifang, the immediate past president of the Taiwanese Pediatric Association, Prof. H.C. Lue, and the Chairman of the Chapter of Paediatricians of Singapore, Dr. Ho Nai-kiong, were also present, and their active participating in the College Forum made the meeting a most memorable occasion.

There have been number of significant development in the strengthening of our ties with the Hong Kong Paediatric Society which also deserve mentioning. We have accepted an invitation to jointly host the next Asian Pacific Pediatric Congress in Hong Kong in March 1997. Many Fellows are now actively engaged in helping to organise this meeting. In addition, we have recently opened negotiations with the Hong Kong Paediatric Society to jointly publish the paediatric journal. On the international scene, our College has widened its contacts with other non-UK sister Colleges. Prof. Yeung has been elected to the Fellowships of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians and the Royal College of Physicians of the Republic of Ireland.

I am indebted to all my colleagues in the Council and to the many other College Fellows for their advice and unfailing support. It is to be hoped that the College can continue to count on their invaluable contributions and support as we face the numerous challenges of the future.

Honorary Secretary's

The College is primarily concerned with postgraduate education, examination in paediatrics and specialist practice in Hong Kong, and the past year has been particularly significant, with the holding of the first local examination, the conferring of a specialist degree in paediatrics and the accreditation of training centres.

Specialist Degree in Paediatrics

December 1993 saw the Inauguration of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. A total of 224 of our Fellows and Members were admitted as Foundation Fellows of the Academy. The degree given was FHKAM (Paediatrics), quotable for specialist recognition.

Intermediate Examination of the College

The College has entered into an agreement with the UK Royal Colleges to hold a joint examination. Those who pass the exam will be awarded an MRCP (UK) as well as our College Certificate of Intemediate Examination. Representatives from our College sat on the MRCP (UK) Examination Boards and UK specialists came to Hong Kong as examiners. The first joint exam ination was held on February 1994.

Accreditation of Training Centres

Accreditation guidelines have been drawn up, based on the number of trainers and the availability of training programmes. Ten paediatric units have applied for accreditation. The process began in July and is expected to be completed by the end of the year.

Educational & Scientific Programmes

The Syllabus of Educational Objectives has been revised and programmes for basic and higher training as well as continuous medical education, are being outlined. A post-graduate

educational programme for trainees was conducted. As for scientific meetings, there was many, including the International Symposium on Jaundice in Infancy and Scientific Papers held jointly with the Hong Kong Paediatric Society in December 1993 and May 1994 respectively, a College Forum in December 1993, a joint meeting with the Hong Kong College of Physicians and the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh in October 1994. There were also lectures and teachin sessions.

Membership

This year 41 Fellows, 24 Members and 22 Associates were newly admitted, bringing the total membership up to 235 Fellows, 85 Members and 23 Associates.

This has been a fruitful year, with the increase in membership, consolidation of training programmes, and the initiation of our College Examination.

The Accreditation Committee was formed in March, 1992. Over the last 2-1/2 years, regular meetings have been held to discuss programmes for the first three years of basic training, the second three years of post-basic training, and the methods of accrediting institutions for such training.

Under the able leadership of Professor S.J. Oppenheimer, the groundwork was laid for the setting up of basic and post-basic training programmes.

Briefly, the basic training consists of two years of core training (1-1/2 years of general paediatrics and 6 months neonatology) and one year of flexible programme, comprising either general paediatrics or blocks of different sub-specialties provided the latter do not contain more than six months of neonatology (i.e. the total duration of neonatology for the three years of basic training should not exceed one year).

The three years of post-basic training may be in general paediatrics or in a sub-specialty (Blocks of subspecialties not exceeding six months are also acceptable). At least six months of the three years should be spent overseas or in another institution in order to compliment the trainee's learning experience and to widen his/her exposure and outlook.

In July this year, I was elected chairman of the Accreditation Committee when Professor Oppenheimer left Hong Kong. We are now embarking on the process of accrediting institutions for basic training.

For subspecialty training, we are still awaiting the final draft of the curricula from the Education Committee before finalising the criteria for accrediting the institutions. We shall, of course, rely heavily on the advice of the subspecialty advisory groups.

In future, all training programmes must be approved in advance. A special application must be made to the Membership Committee for retrospective recognition, and for training obtained overseas. The onus will be on the applicant to provide adequate documents and evidence to satisfy the Committee that he/she has completed the equivalent amount and standard of training. The Membership Committee shall then refer the case to the Accreditation Committee for assessment and training accreditation.

There are still some problems to be resolved when the new system comes into effect. For instance, where should we draw the line between trainees who have completed part of their training and trainers who are just short of being a Fellow? Some institutions will not be able to provide a complete training programme for either the basic or for the sub-specialty training. Networking with other institutions is therefore not only desirable but mandatory. A great deal of co-operation, goodwill and tolerance is required of the parties concerned.

We sincerely hope these problems can be ironed out in the coming years and that the College can take bold steps in the formulation of new training programmes for our future paediatricians.

The Committee held seven meetings this year. Major issues deliberated by the Committee include:-

- (1) Postgraduate education and training of paediatricians
- (2) Continuing medical education
- (3) Educational activities
- (4) Remedial training

One major task of the Committee was to revise the educational objectives of basic training and higher training in general paediatrics and paediatric subspecialties. Subspecialty groups were formed and their recommendations were incorporated into a document named "The Guidelines on Postgraduate Training and Accreditation of Paediatricians". After approval by the Council, the guidelines will be submitted to the Education Committee of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine for endorsement. The guideline will serve as the blueprint for the training of our future paediatricians. A Log Book is being designed to document the details of individual training.

With the help of the heads of all Paediatric Units, a postgraduate training programme for trainees was again implemented. The programme consisted of 15 lectures, 6 seminars, 4 teach-ins and 17 bedside teaching sessions running from January to August 1994. Fellows of the College and guest lecturers provided teaching to the 33 trainees enrolled in the programme at our various hospitals.

Two working groups have been set up to formulate a continuing medical education programme for Fellows. The logistics of running the programme, particularly for Fellows in private practice, have been studied in depth. A proposal will soon be submitted to the Council for deliberation.

In accordance with the guidelines of the Education Committee of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, the Committee has drawn up guidelines for the remedial training of Fellows and Members of the College who did not qualify for Foundation Fellows of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. Eligible Members and Fellows must participate in a remedial training programme. On completion of training, they will be eligible for Fellowship of the College and the Academy.

The Examination Committee assumed its role in the latter part of 1993 after the College entered into an agreement with the three UK Royal College to hold joint examinations in Hong Kong. Prof. T.K. Chan of the College of Physicians and Prof. C.Y. Yeung of our College have been appointed local co-ordinators for this joint venture.

Our operation, as defined in the mutual agreement and published in the "Memorandum", is to nominate local examiners from among our senior Fellows to pair-up with examiners from the UK, subject to the approval of the UK Central Office. We are represented in the Part I and II Board exams by Dr. M.C. Chiu and Prof. C.Y. Yeung respectively. Our local examiners have helped set questions in the written sections of both exams.

The Part II clinical examination follows the arrangement of the past nine years. It is orgainised entirely by local host-examiners and co-ordinated by the Department of Paediatrics of the University of Hong Kong. In the 1994 February examinations, the Clinical was hosted by Prof. C.Y Yeung of Queen Mary Hospital and in October 1994 it was hosted by Queen Mary and Prince of Wales Hospitals. We anticipate that additional major hospitals with good teaching facilities will be recuited to host the future examinations and share the enormous burden of organisation.

The Written Examinations are conducted on the same date at the same times as those in the UK. Twice a year, the Part I MCQs and Part II written are held in Hong Kong. The format of the

clinical is identical to that of the London Royal College. The candidate goes through a long case examination followed by short cases, ending with an oral examination. He/she is examined by three separate examiners pairs comprising of one examiner each from U.K. and Hong Kong Colleges respectively.

The arrangement will ensure sufficient international recognition of our training in Hong Kong and candidates will be awarded the MRCP (UK) qualification in addition to a local intermediate certificate. The agreement stipulates that the arrangements will be subject to review after two years, i.e. in October 1995. We look forward to being able to continue this joint venture which will uphold the international status of our training and professional qualification.

The Committee held four meetings this year and all meetings were well attended by Committee Members.

The Committee discussed:

- (1) Application for different types of College membership by local and overseas doctors.
- (2) The annual application for elevation to the position of Fellow and Member by existing Members and Associates respectively. Applications were received in April and vetted in June. Names were put to the Council in August and successful applicants were notified in September. New Fellows and Members will be admitted to the College at the AGM in November 1994.
- (3) Updating the information on Fellows and Members.
- (4) By-laws of the College, relating to the types of Medical Registrations with the Hong Kong Medical Council to be used as basic criteria for admission of Fellows and Members.
- (5) The requirements for and logistics of running Remedial Courses for Fellows and Members who do not fulfill the requirements of Foundation Fellows of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.

The Committee has made the following recommendations to the College Council:

(1) Admission of:

41 new Fellows

24 new Members

22 new Associates

The figures include 21 newly admitted Members and 3 elevated from Associates.

(2) Total Membership to date: 235 Fellows

85 Members

23 Associates

- (3) Seven more Fellows and Members were recommended to be admitted as Foundation Fellows of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.
- (4) It has been recommended that the procedure for the admitting of new Fellows take the following form:

A fellowship drive involving existing Members

Application to be vetted by the Membership Committee

A list of eligible candidates to be forwarded to the College Council for approval

Fellowship to be awarded at the Annual General Meeting.

Nomination to the Academy Council for Fellowship of the Academy (Note: Fellows of the College should be reminded NOT to quote the title FHKAM (Paediatrics) until the Academy has approved and awarded them the Fellowship)

- (5) The Council has approved the proposed requirements for the Remedial Training Programme for existing Fellows and Members who fail to fulfill the basic criteria for admission as Fellows of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. A detailed programme will be conducted by the Education Committee.
- (6) With regard to applicants for Membership/Fellowship who are "deemed to be registered" in Hong Kong, it was agreed that the College should follow the Academy's criteria. It was recommended that the College ammend its by-laws in order that it might accept applicants with full Hong Kong Medical Council registration or any other registration recognized by the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.
