Announcement

The BGCA 80th Anniversary Scientific Conference will be held on 7-8 October 2016 at Yasumoto International Academic Park, The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Shatin, Hong Kong. The theme this year is "Invest in our Young for a Brighter Tomorrow". This will be a large scale symposium with participation of key stakeholders, government policy-makers and a thousand of professionals from medical & health, social service, education and business sectors. Keynote speakers include Prof James Heckman (Nobel laureate in Economic Sciences with key research in Childhood Intervention Programmes) and Prof Frank Oberklaid (Foundation Director of the Centre for Community Child Health at the Melbourne Royal Children's Hospital). Dr Marco Ho, Hok Kung is one of the plenary speakers and would talk on the Prevention and Management of Childhood Allergic Diseases. 4th Annual Scientific Meeting cum 5th HK-Guangdong-Shanghai-Chongqing Pediatric Exchange Meeting, 3 - 4 December 2016 (Saturday & Sunday), Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Building

College will be hosting an interesting one and a half day Annual Scientific Meeting this year, full day on **Saturday (3 Dec)** and half day on **Sunday (4 Dec)**. The meeting will consist of presentations by local and international experts, 2 case-based educational sessions and a free paper session. This will be a unique opportunity for paediatricians to discuss, share and update clinical paediatric knowledge in an interactive way. Focus will be on cross-disciplinary holistic care of children, scientific updates and presentation of the latest in paediatric research. Abstract submission: Free Paper Sessions / Submission deadline: 7 September 2016

We invite you to submit your abstracts to the Free Paper Session (both clinical and basic science research are welcome). In particular, young investigators are encouraged to submit abstracts to make this meeting a success. You may select “oral presentation” if you do wish to be considered for an oral presentation during the free paper session.

Please email your abstract to the College Secretariat (enquiry@paediatrician.org.hk) using the instructions on the form (**Appendix 4**) which can also be downloaded from the College website. Notification of abstract acceptance and selection for oral presentations will be sent by email in November. Prizes will be awarded for the best oral and poster presentations. All selected abstracts will be published in the Hong Kong Journal of Paediatrics (new series). Due to copyright issues, identical abstracts that have been submitted and presented previously will not be accepted for this meeting.

2016 Best Young Investigator Prize

To encourage research by colleagues, the Best Young Investigator Prize was created in 2015 to be awarded annually to the best paper published between 1 July of previous year and 30 June of the awarding year.

Eligibility

Entry into the Best Young Investigator Prize competition is voluntary.

Applicants must be members of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians (including Associate Members, Members and Fellows) AND aged 46 years or under as at 30 June 2016.

The papers should be published in peer-reviewed print or electronic journals, and written in English or translated into English if they are written in languages other than English.

Only the first author **or** corresponding author is eligible to apply. One paper is eligible for only one submission, and each paper will be allowed to compete for only one prize.

If the paper has previously been awarded the Best Dissertation Prize of the College prior to publication, it will not be eligible for the Best Young Investigator Prize and vice versa.

The decision of the assessment panel will be final.

Submission

Submission deadline for the year 2016 Prize is 31 August 2016. Interested colleagues can email their papers (PDF or MS Word format) together with the Application Form (**Appendix 5**) to the College Secretariat (enquiry@paediatrician.org.hk) **on or before 31 August 2016**.

The Best Young Investigator Prize will include a cash reward of HK\$5,000 and will be presented during the College annual dinner in December.

Announcement from CME Subcommittee

Current CME cycle will end by December 2016. ONLY 5 more months to go. Fellows need to acquire at least 90 CME points, of which 30 points are of Category A, and 15 points are Active. Based on the Academy iCME/CPD data in June 2016, around 340 Fellows have already completed the 2014 – 2016 CME cycle requirements. However, more than 200 Fellows (locals and overseas) still have inadequate total CME points. Breakdown of the deficiencies are as follows. 40% have just less than 90 points but have adequate Cat A and active points. This can be easily rectified by attending local Cat A or B meetings. 36% have less than 30 Cat A but adequate Active points. 15% have adequate Cat A but inadequate Active points. Possible options of getting active CME points are speakers in Cat A or B meetings, answering MCQs in HKJPaed MCQs and web learning through Medscape Pediatrics. Remaining have inadequate Cat A and Active points. Please note if the CME points remain at less than 60 points by year end, Fellows CANNOT be enrolled into the remedial program. As result, the specialist registration status in the Hong Kong Medical Council will be suspended. Please double check your CME profile at the Academy web: <http://www.icmecpd.hk/> and update any outstanding activities. If there are further queries, please contact College secretariat at tel. no: 28718771. In addition, if you have inadequate CME points and intend to become a retired Fellow of the Academy, you need to submit the application to the Academy before end of this year or else you have to complete the remedial first before being allowed to apply.
