## **President's Address at Conferment Ceremony on 4 December 2021**

Good evening, Prof Gilberto Leung, Prof Sophia Chan, Dr Ronald Lam, Dr KL Chung, Presidents and Representatives of sister Colleges, Past Presidents of our College, Fellows and Trainees, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Thank you so much for gracing this auspicious occasion of the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our College and the College Conferment Ceremony with your kind presence.

Impacted by the coronavirus pandemic, regrettably we had to cancel the Fellowship Conferment and Membership Admission Ceremony last year. We are thrilled that this evening with the double cohorts of successful candidates completing the respective stages of paediatric training and their families and colleagues witnessing this milestone moment, the Ceremony is conducted in this nice and much bigger RRS Hall.

New Fellows and New Members, the spotlight of this evening falls onto you. Sincere congratulations go to you on your success in these important stages of training in fulfilling your aspiration as fine paediatricians! You have worked really hard and are well-deserved for the success. Around and behind you are people who have selflessly supported you over the years and immensely contributed to your accomplishments - your families, loved ones and your trainers and colleagues. On behalf of the College I also thank heartily these very important supporters for providing a very caring and inspiring environment so that our trainees can focus on their learning and mature. Thank you very much indeed.

Over the past two years, Hong Kong has faced a lot of societal and public health challenges that have particularly bewildered many of our young doctors, who are already stressed by the competing priorities in this stage of their careers. The paramountcy of showing understanding and kindness as Dr Jonathan Darling, Vice President of the RCPCH mentioned in his talk earlier today, rendering substantiation to their training and protecting their professional progression cannot be over-emphasised. Our College has exercised flexibility in recognising their training, including retrospective accreditation because summative examinations have been cancelled. We have also encouraged trainers to utilise alternative means of training such as more clinical case discussions, tutorials, scenario-based teaching, academic write-ups. For all these, I thank very much colleagues of all the training units.

At the same time, we have made good use of online continuing medical educational activities to cater to the professional needs of our Fellows.

All in all, the pandemic has not deterred the College from serving the best interests of our members. All these measures are made possible only because the entire College has come together, communicated constantly and everyone has put his/ her passion into achieving this common goal. And this is one message I would like to share with our New Fellows and New Members - even under very adverse circumstances, think positive and join hands with each other for the common good. Our College is always behind you, whatever and whenever you need help.

Another message I'd like to share is the importance of general paediatrics including community paediatrics. Our 6-year training appears to be long when compared to quite a few overseas paediatric training programmes. However, I do not see one area in paediatrics that does not entail a holistic approach in the clinical management of a child patient. Atop good book knowledge and clinical skills, there are equally salient skills that make up a communicative, compassionate and competent paediatrician. As the work of the Curriculum Review Working Group proceeds, competency in communication, teamwork, professionalism, advocacy, safeguarding, ethics, taking care of oneself, etc., will be prescribed and assessed with a system of formative assessments in addition to the prevailing high-stakes examinations. Certainly such skills should be instilled and acquired at every work place and training opportunity. College-wide consultation on the curriculum review will start in

the coming months. As New Fellows and New Members, you are specially positioned to contribute your opinions and share your experiences. I hope you will volunteer to do so. We are not adding to the burden of training within our guidelines, we are refining our training framework so that our young paediatricians will be ever better prepared than their predecessors to ensure high standards of service to the community.

The College has come a long way in the past three decades in training, assessment and accreditation. Reaping the bumper harvest of all our Past Presidents and senior paediatricians in building a strong foundation of our College, I am very, very grateful for the honour and privilege to be your President for three years. Sustainability for the success of the College in her missions is the central theme of my presidency and this vision rests on the continued collaboration and backing of every party in this hall, from the Academy, the Bureau and administration, from the Hospital Authority and the Department of Health where our training and assessments take place, our sister Colleges from whom we have learnt a great deal, our Fellows and trainees, and last but not least, our Council and Committees.

I am very happy that I will be handing over the helm to Prof Simon Lam, whom I have the utmost faith in leading our cherished College to scale new heights.

## **Honorary Secretary's Report: 30<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting, Fellows Conferment Ceremony and Annual Dinner on 4 December 2021**

The 30<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting was held successfully on 4 December, 2021 at Lim Por Yen Lecture Theatre of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building.

The minutes of the 29<sup>th</sup> AGM held on 5 December 2020 and of the EGM held on 13 May 2021 were endorsed.

In preparation for the 2021-2024 terms of the four Office Bearers, i.e., President, Vice President, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer, a notice of invitation for nominations for the four posts were sent to all Fellows on 24 September 2021. At the close of the nomination period on 22 October 2021, the College had received two nominations for each post. An election was carried out through postal ballot, and Prof Lam, Hugh Simon Hung San was elected as President, Dr Wu Shun-ping as Vice President, Dr Cheng Wai-tsoi, Frankie as Honorary Secretary and Dr Fong Nai-chung as Honorary Treasurer of the College. The results were endorsed at the Council meeting on 23 November 2021 and carried at the 30<sup>th</sup> AGM.

Mr Kenneth Sit and Walter Ma & Co. were re-appointed as the College's Honorary Legal Advisor and Auditor respectively for year 2021.

In view of increases in regular operating expenses of the College over the past five years, in order to avoid structural deficit, an increase of annual subscription fees for Fellows, Members and Associates was endorsed at the AGM. The adjusted fees were as follows: HK\$2,300 for Fellows, HK\$1,150 for Overseas Fellows, HK\$1,500 for Members, HK\$750 for Overseas Members and HK\$800 for Associates. The subscription fee for paediatricians aged 65 or above before 1 January 2022 would be waived according to our usual practice.

The Admission Ceremony of new Members and conferment of new Fellows was held after shortly after the AGM. This was followed by presentation of subspecialty certificates new Subspecialty Fellows from 3 subspecialties, namely Paediatric Immunology, Allergy & Infectious Diseases (PIAID), Paediatric Neurology (PN) & Paediatric Respiratory Medicine (PRM).

We are grateful to Prof Gilberto Leung Ka-kit, President of the HK Academy of Medicine, Prof Sophia Chan, JP, Secretary for Food & Health of the HKSAR Government, Dr Ronald Lam Man-kin, Director of Health, Dr Chung Kin-lai, Director (Quality & Safety) and the Presidents and representatives of Sister Colleges who graced us with their presence and bestowed the day's events with their blessings.

The jazz music by Dr Charles Wong and his band, Cool Cats N Docs, at our cocktail reception created a warm and relaxing ambience to enhance the celebratory atmosphere, while our new Fellows in their College gowns and caps mingled and took pictures with friends and family.

The 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner was held simultaneously at the Run Run Shaw Hall of the Academy and Neptune's Restaurant of the Ocean Park and attended by a record number of 300 participants. Our Young Fellows worked hard to keep our guests entertained and had prepared a 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary commemorative video with the theme "Past, Present and Future of Paediatrics in Hong Kong". Guests also enjoyed the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary College music video which was composed and written by Dr Alison Ma. There were many touching moments.

With the New Year ahead, we look optimistically to the future of our College as we continue to work together to adapt our Paediatricians to the changing times to ensure the health and well-being of children, young people and their families. We would also take this opportunity to wish you and your families all a very Merry Christmas and a joyful New Year!

## **30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebratory Activities of our College**

## Year 2022 Annual Subscription

With the upcoming start to a new year, it is time again to call for payment of your Hong Kong College of Paediatricians annual subscription. Kindly settle your annual subscription fees as follows:

- (1) HK\$2,300 for Fellows.
- (2) HK\$1,150 for Overseas Fellows who have applied for and been granted overseas status by the College.
- (3) Fellows, Members and Associates over the age of 65 before 1 January 2022 are exempted from paying their annual subscription fee (i.e. Date of Birth on/before 31 Dec 1956).
- (4) HK\$1,500 for Members.
- (5) HK\$ 750 for Overseas Members who have applied for and been granted overseas status by the College.
- (6) HK\$ 800 for Associates.

## Announcing the 2021 Best Dissertation Prize and 2021 Best Young Investigator Prize winners

### The 2021 Best Dissertation Prize (BDP)

- Dr SO Chi Tak Enoch (PWH) for his paper entitled “*Establishing a Risk Stratification Scoring System for IVIG resistance in Paediatric Kawasaki Disease in Hong Kong*”, which was presented in the RCPCH Conference Singapore 2021.

### The 2021 Best Young Investigator Prize (BYIP)

- Dr POON Wing Yiu Sarah (QMH) for her paper entitled “*Who should return for an oral glucose tolerance test? A proposed clinical pathway based on retrospective analysis of 332 children*”, which has been published in the Journal of Pediatric Endocrinology and Metabolism.

## Accreditation Committee

The Accreditation Committee has updated its guidelines and procedures in October 2021. The new guidelines have been approved by the Academy and are now posted on the webpage of the committee.

The update was based on the version dated 24 February 2015. The changes are mainly on the layout; section on the programme, institutions, trainers, training interruption, overseas training, elective training and retrospective accreditation were listed separately for clarity.

The latest Council resolutions were added. The notable additions are

- (1) The requirement of 12 months of Basic Training at an institution with regular emergency admissions as part of the core module.
- (2) The conditions of part-time training during Higher Training
- (3) The conditions of part-time trainers
- (4) The requirement of paediatric patient contacts during elective training at non-paediatric training (e.g. at Accident and Emergency Department)
- (5) The adjustment to Neonatology Training capacity when delivery numbers fall short of requirement.

Old clauses that are no longer applicable were removed during this update, for instance, the four-subspecialty rotation in lieu of General Paediatric core module in Basic training that no longer exists.
