#### Vice President's Message

Dear Fellows, Members and Associates,

The fifth wave of omicron variant of SARS-CoV-2 has hit Hong Kong badly. Starting from early February, the constant influx of patients has overwhelmed most hospitals. There was a time when the Paediatric isolation facilities were completely occupied, leading to a hold-up of children at the Emergency Departments, thus further adding to their burden.

Fortunately, the disease associated with the virus was relatively mild and self-limited in most children. Nonetheless there were a few cases of fatalities in early February. Whether these cases have shifted the parents' collective awareness to vaccination is arguable. In fact, in mid-February SCMP reported a survey that showed an alarmingly high proportion of parents were still reluctant to let their children get immunized. It would seem that there are prevailing misbeliefs about vaccination that we need to dispel.

Many Paediatricians have been active in educating the public about vaccination. I am very thankful for their efforts. The College has also written to the Secretary for Food and Health, the Secretary of the Civil Service and the Secretary for Education asking them to expand the community vaccination capacity and to pay attention to residential schools and creches. After an appeal in late February, we are pleased to find out that our fellows in private practice have also been very enthusiastic in driving up the vaccine coverage.

I have written to the Director of Health about the availability of antipyretics in early March. Reassurance was given to me that the local manufacturers and suppliers have been requested to increase production and supply. The Department of Health issued a statement on this shortly after my letter, advising the public not to stockpile unnecessarily.

I hope the COVID situation has somewhat abated by the time this message reaches you. Collaboration is the key in the fight against a pandemic of this magnitude. I would like to express my most heartfelt gratitude to you all who have fought SARS-CoV-2, our common enemy, at various fronts.

Stay well and keep safe.

#### **Announcement from CME Subcommittee**

Please note that the current CME/CPD cycle starting on 1 January 2020 will end on 31 December 2022. Fellows need to obtain a minimum of 90 points (in which 30 points should be Category A; 15 points should be active) in order to comply with the CME/CPD requirements. The CME Subcommittee would like to suggest Fellows to plan their CME/CPD activities in a manner so as to ensure they can fulfill at least the remedial requirements (60 points) in the remaining period of the cycle.

Please note that failure to comply will affect the Academy Fellowship and eligibility to remain on the Specialist Register in the Medical Council of Hong Kong. If Fellows would like to remain as "Retired Fellow" of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, they need to submit the request to the Academy before the end of this cycle. If not, Fellows are required to complete the Remedial Program in the following year before being accepted as a Retired Fellow of the Academy.

#### **E-Portfolio System**

Dear Basic Trainees / Higher Trainees,

The E-portfolio system (<u>https://eps.paediatrician.org.hk</u>) has been officially launched on 1 January 2022. The usage of the system has been increasing, but at a very slow pace.

If you have not started using EPS, I would like to take this opportunity to encourage you to log on and fill out your personal information. Trainees are also required to log their training by EPS. It will soon replace all paper forms of training record. The personal, appointment and professional profile entries are essential for fellowship nomination with HKAM via electronic means, completion is essential before interfacing can be established.

There will be a learning curve. But we are sure that, as time goes by, every one will be more familiar with the operation of the system.
