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Message from the Editors

Cool and dry northerly winds remind us that we are entering the fourth quarter of the year. In less than two months' time we will be sharing the joy of our new Fellows and Members in the Conferment Ceremony and Annual Dinner. On the same day we also have 2022 Paediatric Update No. 2 and 31st Annual General Meeting. Please mark this important date in your diary. We look forward to your participation and support!

President's Message

Catalysed by recent high-profile cases of child abuse, the government has been driven to respond to the long-standing issue of child maltreatment in Hong Kong. The approach that the government has taken has been to move towards mandatory reporting requirement for suspected child abuse cases. The belief is that this will ensure early identification of high-risk cases so that early and effective interventions may be implemented. However, while this approach may have some impact on early reporting, it is apparent to professionals who work with children that many more additional measures are required to ensure that a comprehensive and holistic approach to safeguarding is delivered.

While early identification of high-risk and vulnerable children is important, it is also important to be able to care for these children in environments conducive to their growth and development. Resources to improve childcare facilities and community support are vital to keep children out of acute hospital beds while awaiting resolution of their social issues. A more nuanced approach is also needed for the various forms of maltreatment of children and young people at different stages of their development. We should also be concerned about the underlying factors that lead to child maltreatment and focus resources on addressing these issues to reduce risk of maltreatment. To continue to raise awareness of these issues we have invited Dr YK Shiu, a Member of our Curriculum Review Workgroup, and Dr Alison Steele, Officer of Child Protection of the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health to talk about training paediatricians about safeguarding as part of our Paediatric Update programme on 3 December 2022. Further details can be found in our Paediatric Update No. 2 announcement in this issue of our newsletter. Please do join us to learn more and give us your views.

While social stresses have only been exacerbated by the pandemic, many common childhood respiratory infections such as acute bronchiolitis, that were previously commonly encountered in our practice, have all but disappeared. Despite this, we must continue to remain vigilant and watch out for a potential resurgence as social restrictions are relaxed. Fellows and Trainees may peruse the recently updated "Clinical Guidelines on the Management of Acute Bronchiolitis" that has been published in the Contemporary Practice in Paediatrics section of the Hong Kong Journal of Paediatrics (<https://www.hkjpae.org/details.asp?id=1406&show=1234>).

Consultation on Curriculum Review

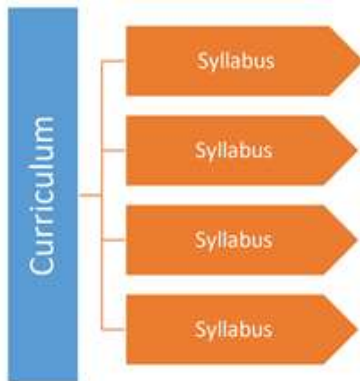
Dear Fellows, Members and Associates of the College,

The Working Group on Curriculum Review has launched the third stage consultation. The consultation material is now uploaded onto <https://hkpaedcr.paediatrician.org.hk>.

This consultation will focus on the syllabuses, i.e. the scope of knowledge and skills at each area we usually call a subspecialty. During the first six years of training, we believe that all the knowledge and skills are to equip a General Paediatrician, and therefore these syllabuses will collectively describe what General Paediatrics is. We have more than 20 syllabus proposals, and would like to invite you to give your opinion on them.

We are aware that the training path and opportunity of trainees may differ one from another. The syllabuses are therefore guidance to trainees and trainers. A trainee is expected to acquire knowledge of different areas at variable breadths and depths. But we feel that the areas covered are essential in the daily work of a paediatrician.

Syllabuses are built on a backbone of learning objective and key capabilities. The relationship between syllabuses and curriculum can be visualized as follows:



We have listed some domains from the curriculum statement as essential skills that we think are of particular relevance to an area. There are also "desirable skills" that trainees are encouraged to acquire during training.

Overlaps of knowledge in different areas are naturally expected. So you may find duplication of items in these proposals. We do not see the need to avoid these duplications.

Announcement from CME Subcommittee

Please note that the current CME/CPD cycle starting on 1 Jan 2020 will end on 31 December 2022. Fellows need to obtain a minimum of 90 points of which 30 points are Category A and 15 points active, to comply with the Academy CME/CPD requirements. Please make sure you will engage enough activities in the remaining months to fulfill the requirement.

If the 2020-2022 cycle is your first CME cycle, you are required to obtain CME points pro-rata to a three-year cycle according to your CME start date. Please note the minimum requirement of individual CME category is waived if the first cycle is shorter than 3 years, so you can obtain CME points from ANY category.

Failure to comply will affect your Academy Fellowship and you will NOT be entitled to remain on the Specialist Register in the Medical Council of Hong Kong. If you have less than 60 CME points, you are NOT entitled for remedial, ending up in immediate removal of your specialist status in MCHK.

If Fellows would like to remain as “Retired Fellow” of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, they need to submit the request to the Academy before the end of this cycle. If not, Fellows are required to complete the Remedial Program in the following year before being accepted as a Retired Fellow of the Academy.
