Guidelines on Higher Training

The Council wishes to remind ALL trainees who have entered into Higher Training in Paediatrics from 1 July 2001 and thereafter should adhere to the Guidelines on Higher Training (vide infra). During the interim period between 1 July 2001 and 30 June 2004, the College would deal with minor infractions rules of these by trainees sympathetically provided there is a good reason. ALL trainees sitting the Exit Assessment in June 2004 or thereafter, irrespective of the date of commencement of training, should fulfill ALL of the following training requirements:

1. The duration of supervised Higher Training should be no less than 3 years in College accredited centres.

2. There should be at least 2 years of hospitalbased paediatrics, of which not less than 12 months should be devoted to general paediatrics with acute emergency hospital admission of children not restricted to any age group or paediatric subspecialty.

3. The trainee may opt to undergo training for not more than 12 months in one paediatric subspecialty (as defined in the Guideline for Paediatric Training) inclusive of the 6 months obligatory rotation to local and overseas training centres should such a rotation is through the same paediatric subspecialty opted for.

4. The trainee may also opt to undergo training for not more than 12 months in child

health related specialties (e.g. child psychiatry, maternity child health clinics, school health service, etc) of which not more than 6 months should be spent in any single specialty and inclusive of the 6 months obligatory rotation to local and overseas training centres should such a rotation is through the same child health related specialty.

5. All trainees must undergo a 6-month obligatory rotation through other training unit(s) (Local/ Overseas). Prospective applications must be submitted, at least 3 months before the commencement of overseas training, to the Accreditation Committee together with the basic and essential information required to accompany any such application. The Accreditation Committee should also be notified before a trainee starts the rotation to other local training unit(s).

The 5th Guangdong-Hong Kong Paediatric Exchange Conference

The 5th Guangdong-Hong Kong Paediatric Exchange Conference will be held on **Saturday July 24, 2004**. This time our College will host the conference in Hong Kong. Please mark your diary and make an effort to participate. Details of venue and scientific programmes and call for abstracts will be announced as soon as possible.

CME Subcommittee

Fellows who started their CME cycle on 1st January each year should have already submitted their Annual Return Forms to the College Secretariat. For those who have not done so, we urge you to make your submissions as soon as possible. The following documents are needed:

- 1. The Annual Return Form;
- 2. Copies of your Log-Book entries;
- 3. Copies of attendance certificates of any overseas meetings attended.

Please note that you will receive a fax of acknowledgement of receipt from the College. If you have not received it, your documents may not have arrived safely and please enquire at the College Secretariat (Tel. no. 28718871). Late submissions may not be included in our report to the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.

Medical Council resolution on CME for all practising doctors

Fellows may be aware that the Medical Council resolved in March 2002 that CME would be made a requirement for all practising doctors, starting from January 2005.

It is anticipated that a 3-year practising certificate would replace the existing 1-year certificate effective from January 2005 and that the specialist CME would be required for renewal of Practising Certificate. As such, the Academy Council has decided to synchronize the CME cycles with the duration of the practising certificate. The Academy Council agreed that all CME cycles for existing Fellows shall start afresh from 1 January 2005. In order to achieve this end, CME cycles started within 3 years before 1 January 2005 will have to be counted on a pro-rata basis. This means that if a Fellow's CME cycle length before 1 January 2005 is 1.5 years, the Fellow shall need to gain 45 CME points before 1 January 2005.

The following table shows the number of CME points each Fellow will need to obtain up to 31 December 2004 according to the date his/her CME cycle starts:

Appendix I

Diploma in Child Health Examination (DCH) 2004

The Hong Kong College of Paediatricians (HKCPaed) and the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (RCPCH) will hold a Joint Diploma in Child Health Examination in Hong Kong this year, awarding DCH (HK) and DCH (International) to the successful candidates.

The Examination will be divided into two parts, Written and Clinical. As from January 2004, the Membership of the RCPCH (MRCPCH) Part 1 Examination will consist of two papers - Part 1A and Part 1B. The Paper 1A (Basic Child Health) will replace the current Diploma in Child Health (DCH) written papers. Successful completion of the Part 1A Examination will entitle the candidate to up to three attempts at the DCH Clinical Examination before being required to re-enter the written examination.

The MRCPCH Part 1A (& 1B) Examination will be held in Hong Kong on Wednesday, 5 May 2004. The examination fee for the MRCPCH Part 1A Examination is HK\$2,800.

Candidates who wish to enter the MRCPCH Part 1A Examination must hold a registrable medical qualification in Hong Kong.

Application: Candidates who wish to sit the examination in Hong Kong **MUST** apply through the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians (HKCPaed). Application forms and examination regulation booklets are obtainable from the following address: Hong Kong College of Paediatricians Room 808, Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Hong Kong (Tel: 2871 8871; Fax: 2785 1850). Alternatively, candidates can access the RCPCH website at http://www.rcpch.ac.uk to obtain information and download the enrolment forms under the section on "Publications" followed by "Examinations documents".

Completed application forms should be returned to the HKCPaed at the above address with the required examination fee in the form of a crossed cheque made payable to: 'Hong Kong College of *Paediatricians*' The HKCPaed reserves the right to admission for the examination and priority will be given to candidates taking both the Part 1A and 1B examinations.

Please note the Joint DCH Clinical Examination is expected to be held in Hong Kong in November 2004. This Clinical Examination is open to registered medical practitioners in Hong Kong but there will be a limit to the number of entries. Candidates should have at least 6 months of Paediatric practice (resident medical officer or intern) in a recognized institution with acute hospital admissions. Applicants who were externs need to provide evidence of regular on-call duties during their externship training in a recognized training institution. Further details on the Clinical Examination will be announced at a later date.

Deadline for application: 5 March 2004 (to allow processing time to meet the U.K. closing date of 26 March 2004)
