Fellowship Conferment Ceremony, December 2005 Address by the President, Professor TF Fok

Professor Tang, Dr Vivian Wong, Dr TH Leung, Dr KK Kwok, Presidents and representatives from our sister colleges, Honoured Guests, Fellows and Members of the College, Our new graduates, ladies and gentlemen.

First I would like to welcome all of you to the Fellowship Conferment Ceremony of the Hong Kong College of Paediatricians. We are very honoured by the presence of so many distinguished guests and the presidents and representatives of our sister colleges. I would in particular like to welcome Professor Grace Tang who is attending our ceremony for the first time as the President of the Academy. I thank you all for gracing us with your presence.

Today we gather together to witness and celebrate the graduation of our trainees. To all our graduates I extend to you our congratulations for your achievement. The fellowship that is going to be conferred to you very shortly is the result of many long years of hard work, and serves as a testament of your ability in looking after sick children. Graduation ceremonies are sometimes called commencement ceremonies, which mean that you are now ready to begin a new chapter in your life. As a Paediatrician, of course you should begin to think of doing something good for children. Tom Brokaw, the famous and once rated number one American television journalist once said in a graduation ceremony, "You are educated. You may think of your qualification as the ticket to a good life. Let me ask you to think of an alternative. Think of it as your ticket to change the world". I am not asking you to try to change the world by way of a revolution; I am only appealing to you that starting from today, you should begin to endeavour to make this world a little better for our children. As a specialist Paediatrician, which you soon will be, you are equipped with the skills to offer sick children high quality medical care. You are also duty-bound to be a child advocate carrying the sacred responsibilities of protecting them from sickness, poverty, ignorance and social injustice. These menaces are haunting millions of children worldwide. Some are prevalent even in affluent societies such as our own.

Dear graduates, as you begin this new chapter you should also take better care of yourself and your family. You have spent many long years working very hard to have come this far. Now that you do not have to study till late hours after work, your family must be very relieved because from now on you can lead a more normal life. Indeed it is your duty to spend more time with them and be good to them. There is nothing in the world that can substitute having quality time with your elderly parents, your spouses, and your young children. You should also have some leisure time for yourself. Professor Sir James Mirrlees, Nobel Laureate in Economics and Professor at large of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, once told the graduates in one of the university congregations" "But now, you will become busy, and risk being too busy to keep learning and exploring. A word of advice. Do not be too busy. That is hard. You may make more money that way, but it is not good life". Only by having some leisure time, you can recharge your battery; nurture your creativity and your relationship with your friends and people around you.

Dear graduates, there is one last responsibility that you should fulfill if you have not already done so. Now you have more time, you should explore the opportunity (and subsequently put into practice) of going through the process that ensures the continuation of the human race. Or putting it more simply, find someone you can love, get married and have as many children as you can. This is one contribution you can make to mankind and to our profession in particular.

Announcement from CME Subcommittee

Call for submission of CME Annual Return Forms before 31st January 2006

All Fellows are reminded to submit the following documents to the College before 31st January 2006:

1. Their completed Annual Return Forms (for Fellows whose cycles end in December, it should cover the period January to December 2005; for Fellows whose cycles started in July, it should cover the period July 2005 to December 2005);

2. Copies of Attendance Certificates of Overseas Meetings attended;

3.Copies of the new ARF form are available for download from the College Web (http://www.paediatrician.org.hk) or in the reminder letter from CME Subcommittee, which will be sent to all Fellows shortly.

For local Fellows, the most convenient way to check your Cat A, B and E CME points is through the HKAM MLMS system. According to the Academy, all the CME activities in 2005 should be uploaded by mid January 2006. If you agreed with the CME points documented in the MLMS, you can simply print out the report and attached in the ARF as proof of attendance. Please note that the College Secretariat will fax you a notice to confirm receipt of your submission. If you do not get the notice within a week, your forms might not have reached the College Secretariat safely and I would advise you to call and check the status.

Other issues related to the new CME/CPD Guidelines

- With the new CME cycle, there is no maximum CME points for Fellows to accumulate each year. In other words, you can acquire the full 90 points within minimum of 30 Cat A CME points required for the 3-year cycle within 1 year, even though it is not advisable.
- The Council has also endorsed imposing penalties for late returns with details under the College's new CME/CPD Guidelines, section VI 6.5. A charge of HK\$500 shall be levied if a Fellow fails to return the form after the deadline. This amount will be doubled if the Fellow fails to submit the ARF 3 months after the first notification.
- For your convenience, extra copies of Annual Return Forms and sections of log book for Category A, B, C, D and E activities can be downloaded from the College homepage, CME section.
