Hong Kong College of Paediatricians Foundation will be carrying out two medical missions next year to the above two places to teach their rural doctors on Neonatal Resuscitation and to donate essential medical equipment to the rural hospitals. We need Fellows to assist in lecturing (in Mandarin) and teaching of practical resuscitation techniques.

Details are as follows:

Yunnan Mission:

4th March, 2007–8th March, 2007: Teaching in Kunming Children's Hospital or at a rural hospital.

Qinghai Mission and Tour of Tibet:

4th July, 2007–8th July, 2007: Teaching in Qinghai Women and Children's Hospital

9th July, 2007-15th July, 2007: Tour of Tibet by travelling in the new Qinghai Tibet Railway. This

will be a unique experience to visit Tibet and the HuaXia Foundation

will assist us in the tour arrangements.

As Tibet has an altitude of 5,000 metres, one should be aware of mountain sickness before embarking on this journey. July is the peak season and we have to let the local authorities know in advance how many of us are joining. Please inform Mrs. Christine Leung **preferably on or before 15 December, 2006**. We shall provide you with further details of the cost and itinerary once we know how many of our Fellows are interested. Family members are welcomed to join.
