Procedures for Accreditation of Paediatric Subspecialties in Hong Kong

(Interim guidelines as at 4 Dec 2008 subject to further modifications when necessary)

Procedures List

- 1) Subspecialty Group to submit application of programme duly endorsed by 2 external referees
- *2) Vetting Committee to vet the application / to make recommendation to Council

3) Council to approve the commencement of accreditation procedures

* 4) Assessment Committee: to interview the provisional First Fellows

5) Formation of Provisional Subspecialty Board

- Composition: 7-8 members including:
- i) 5 Fellows nominated by the subspecialty group from the list of potential 1st Fellows preferably including representatives from HA, DH, Universities and privte sectors; and to be approved by the College Council;
- ii) One Fellow (not in that subspecialty) appointed by the Council and preferably from the Working Group (with voting right);
- iii) One external assessor;
- iv) One counterpart from related subspecialties of sister colleges where appropriate

*6) Appointment of External Assessor by Council (cost to be borne by College)

* 7) External Assessor to assess the programme, field visit to potential training centres and to recommend to the College for approval of the programme *8) Submission of the training programme and list of 1st Fellows to College Council for approval

*9) Submission of Programme to the HKAM Education Committee and Council for approval

* 10) Application to the MCHK for listing as a Paed Subspecialty Register and for quotability of FHKCPaed (Subspecialty)

11) Formation of Subspecialty Board

- Composition: 6 Fellows of the College including:
- i) 5 Fellows in that subspecialty (appointed *preferably* from the University, HA, DH and the private sector);
- ii) One Fellow (not in that subspecialty) appointed by Council;
- Chairman: to be elected by Subspecialty Board members, appointed by Council

- Functions of Subspecialty Board:
- a) Set training and accreditation guidelines for the subspecialty
- b) In coordination with the External Assessor, to accredit training programmes including programme director, training centres, modules, trainers and trainees
- c) Organise Subspecialty Board examinations, and appoint examiners
- d) Administer CME/CPD programme for the subspecialty

12) Announcement of the date of starting of formal training programme

- Training programme should start within 24 months after approval of the subspecialty by the HKAM Council
- College should cease admitting First Fellows when such formal training programme has started
- There will be no remedial programme for candidates not fulfilling First Fellow requirements at cut-off date

Title of a Paediatric Subspecialists

- Fellow of HKAM (Paediatrics)
- Fellow of HKC Paed
- * Title of HKCPaed (Subspecialty): a College Fellow with completion of a formal structural training programme and full assessment process. (1st Fellows who had not undergone a structural training programme would NOT be able to quote this title.)

The following criteria should be considered for defining a subspecialty, namely:

- Parallel cases in other places
- Feasibility of such a subspecialty (or combined subspecialties) in HK
- Appropriateness and relevance of the training programme
- Sustainability
- Mechanism for monitoring
- External referees' views

Appointment of Director of Subspecialty Boards

- Announce to all College Fellows
- Criteria for nomination:
- 1. A senior Fellow with at least 10 years post College Fellowship experience
- 2. Having good professional standing and experience in Paediatrics and Child Health
- * Appointment mechanism:
- Council to select among the list of eligible candidates by secret ballot. Consideration given to the following qualities:
- 1. Having experience in developing and supervising subspecialty training programmes
- 2. Having served in the Council or Standing Committees of the College (be familiar with the operation of the College)
- 3. Having been involved in the development of subspecialty accreditation guidelines of the College

General Principles for Consideration

- Consensus of opinion arrived at by the majority view of members from that subspecialty group is vital
- No preset priorities for subspecialty implementation by the College
- Maturation, service needs, readiness are some of the factors for consideration
- Final approval : decided by College Council, basing on the principle of fostering collaboration and avoiding confrontation

Commonly Asked Questions (1)

- Quality before implementation
- Subspecialty implementation voluntary
- Centre of Excellence in Paediatrics (CEP) a catalyst but not a determining factor
- No deadlines for implementation by College
- Subspecialty Society NOT same as College Subspecialty Board
- Subspecialty Society members NOT necessarily First Fellows of the Subspecialty
- Hong Kong can have one or more than one programmes for each paed subsp provided accreditation data and requirement permits

Commonly Asked Questions (2)

- Consensus programme from subspecialty groups essential for implementation
- Majority views of potential First Fellows more important than views of solo authorities
- Views of external assessors important for College consideration
- The College would adopt flexible approach in the accreditation procedure and for First Fellows
- Final interview of First Fellows meant for assessment of relevant qualifications and training experience and NOT meant as an examination

- Working Group keen to collect views and opinions from professional colleagues (Societies and individual Fellows) for future implementation
- Do submit your application of the programme to the College (first step to initiate the accreditation process) when you are ready
